The first two years of the ROTC is compulsory at Oklahoma A & M College. Following this, these students under ROTC deferment who are selected, will continue and through the two years of advanced ROTC classes into and through the two years of advanced ROTC during their junior and senior years, terminating in their receipt of an academic degree and a commission in the U. S. Army or Air Force reserve.

Advance course students draw 90 cents per day, or \$27 per month. Basic students (the first two years) attend classes in uniform only two hours per week and attend three hours of drill. Advance course students go to three classes four hours per week and attend the same hours of drill.

In addition to the academic studies and military drill, there are opportunities for valuable friendships and the wholesome extracurricular activities provided by student chapters of national military fraternities and organizations such as Pershing Rifles, Scabbard and Blade, Arnold Air society, and American Society of Military Engineers.

All of these organizations are honorary in nature and accessible by only the most outstanding students in the several fields. Every advance course student is automatically a member of the Cadet Officers Club.

There are also four rifle teams at Oklahoma A & M College, Army and USAF teams, the Varsity team, and the Rifle team. During the last six years, A & M rifle teams were among the top teams of the nation, winning in their best year, 1948, first place in the Fourth Army intercollegiate matches; first place in Pershing Rifles matches, first place in the NRA sectional matches and second place in the Fourth Army Area matches.

The military department has an excellent 8-point indoor firing range, and a 16-point outdoor firing range which have added to the interest and enthusiasm of rifle marksmanship.
