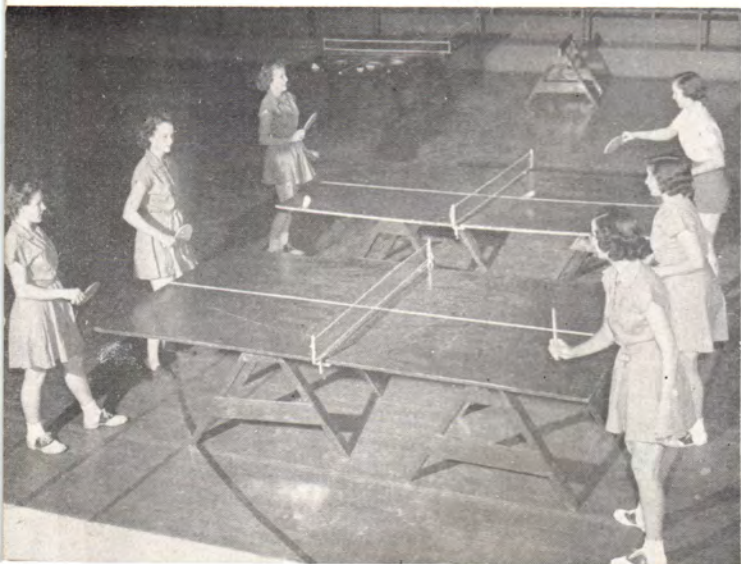

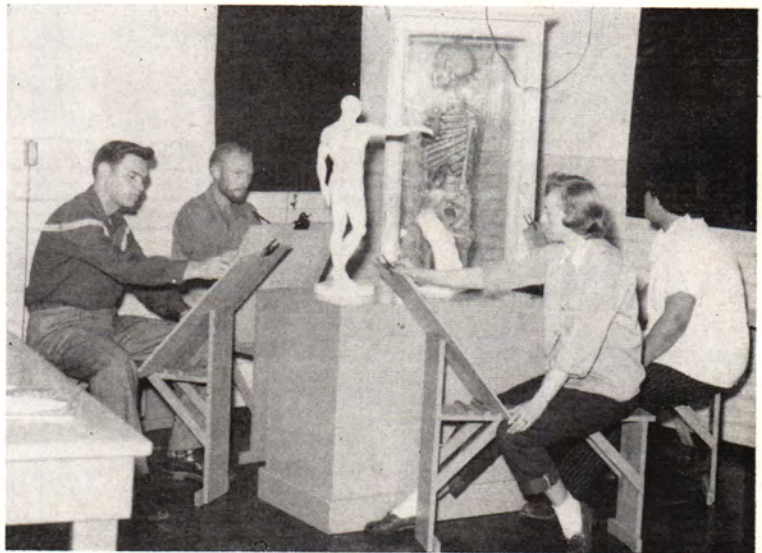


Art division

The Wood Shop

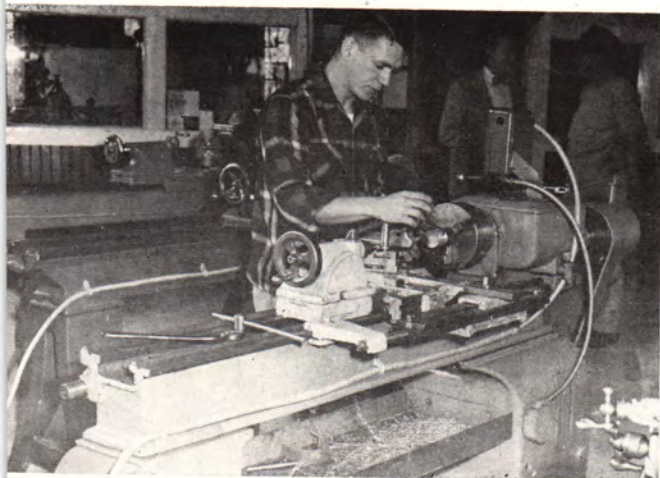
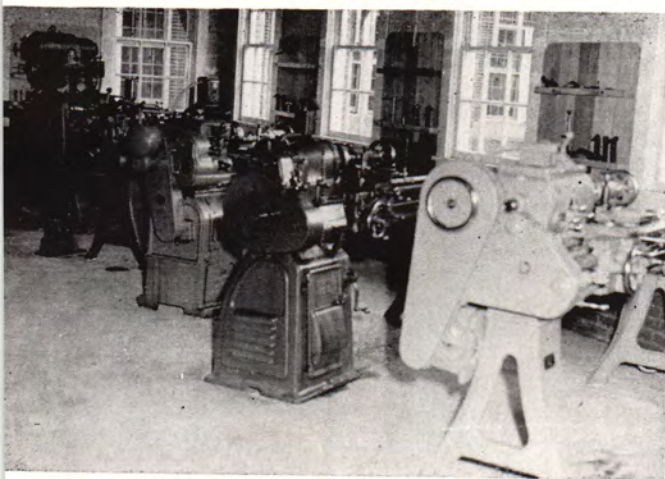
As one enters the wood shop, he smells the blended odors of shavings mingled with the pungent smell of paint and sealer coming from the paint room.

One hears the hum and buzz of the many machines along the walls. Through these sounds, the high, shrill whine of the jointer pierces like an arrow to one's ears.

You can see many operations being carried out at the same time. People are ripping and cross-cutting boards, making dado joints in furniture, nailing and gluing finished materials together, and in the finish room, putting the final touches to their projects.
