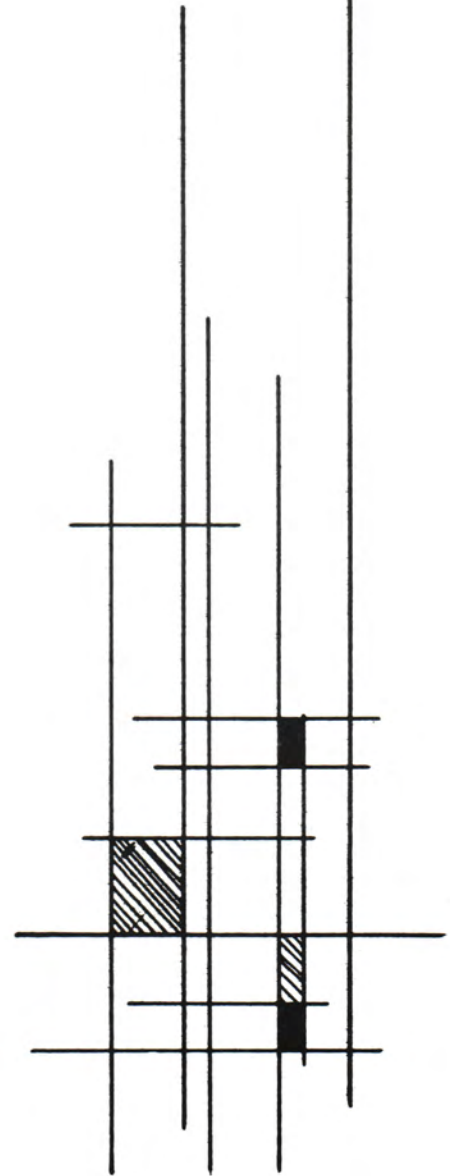


# Dedication

Halfbacks Gary Williamson, Warren Weller and Steve Priborsky combined brilliant faking and running to monopolize the rest of the game as the Norse sped to a 22-0 lead before Dave Gleason scored for the opponents. The final Norse touchdown came on a 4-yard pass from Foy McClung to Marvin Sun Eagle.

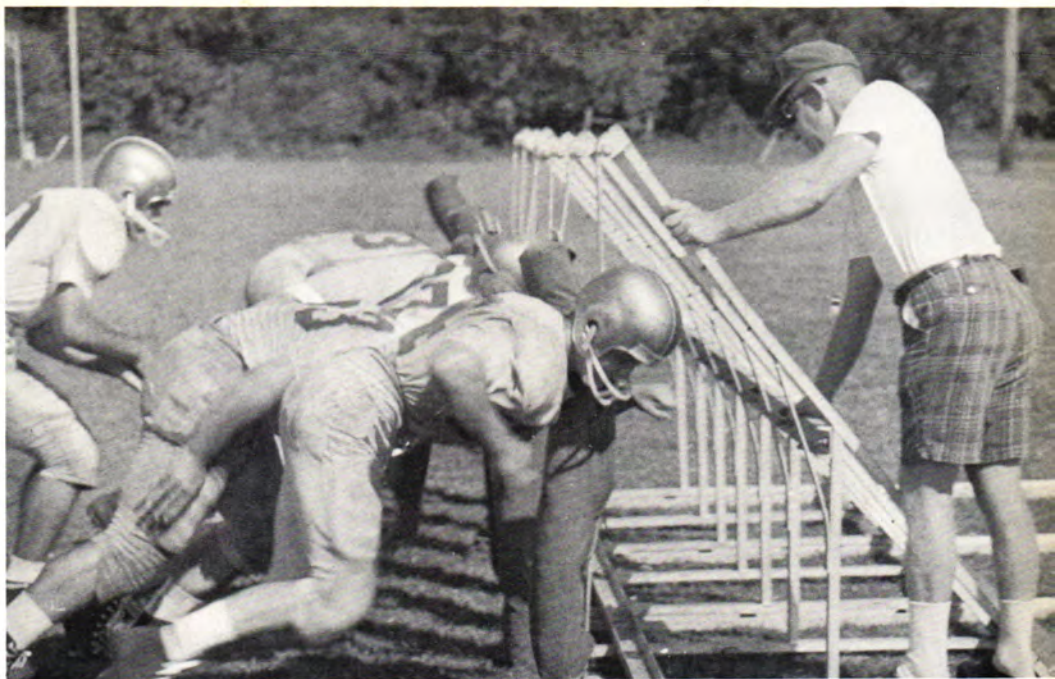

(It was the only time during the season that the Norse were held to less than three touchdowns in a game). The lone touchdown for the Norsemen came in the fourth quarter when fullback Charles Bowen broke through the line. The Grand Rapids quarterback, Sydloski, a 6-5 transfer from Michigan State, poured passes over the heads of the Norse defenders throughout the game as the Norsemen dropped their second game of the season to the highly-rated Raiders.

The Norse held a 7-0 lead at the quarter, and still were leading 20-13 at halftime. Both teams scored twice in the third quarter, and the Norse still led 34-27 at the end of the quarter. With the score 34-33, and a third-and-10 situation, the Aggie quarterback Bill Harper connected on a pass to Joe Don Looney who ran 73 yards for the winning touchdown. Northeastern's long list of All-Americans grew even longer this year as Norse footballer John B. Simmons received honors.

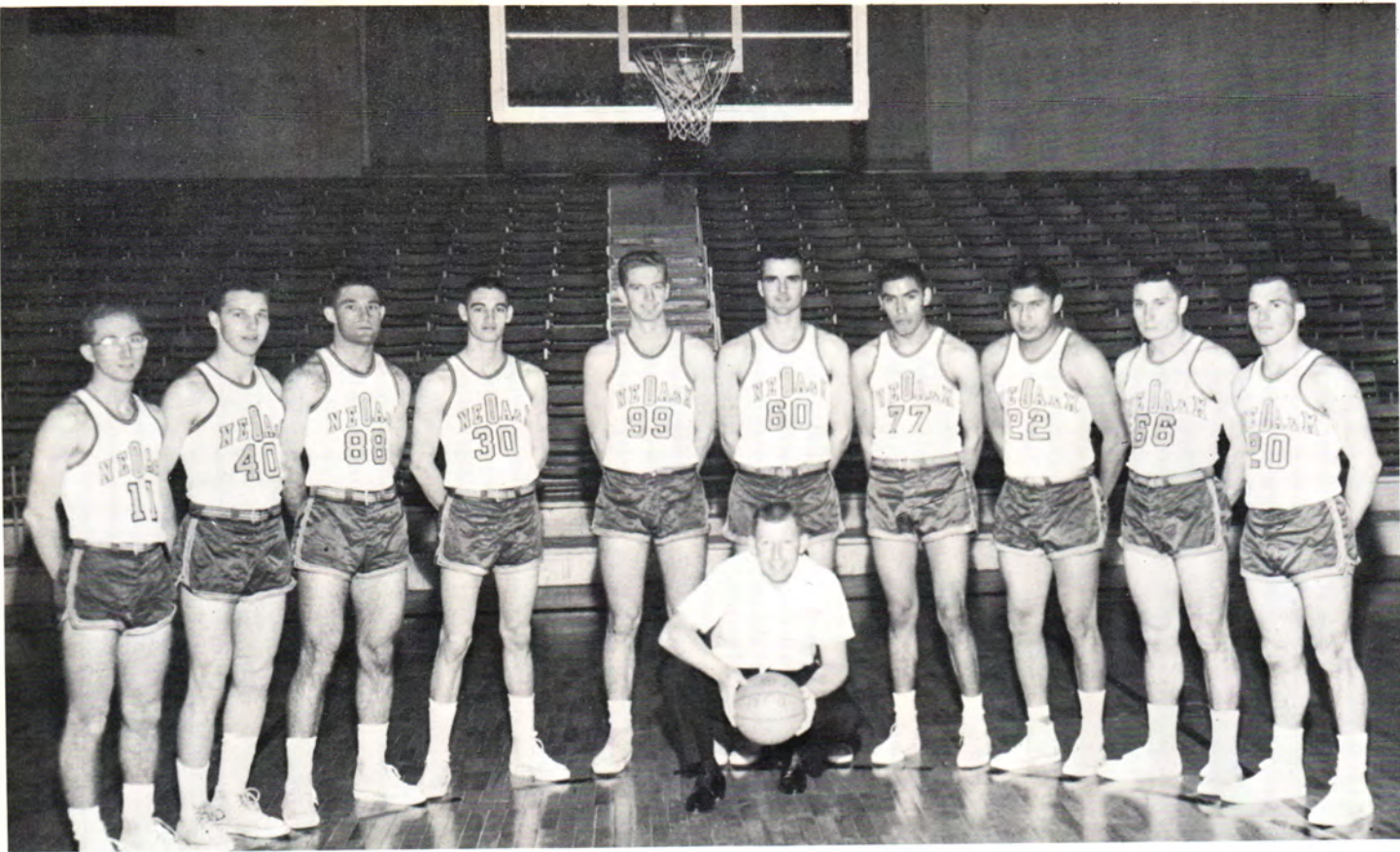
Simmons, a 6-3, 202 pound sophomore from Omaha, was the right end on the team and was the leading Norse scorer.

Although Simmons was an offensive standout in nearly every game, his most spectacular performance came in the homecoming game with Cameron. Simmons scored three touchdowns as quarterbacks Gene Burlison and Foy McClung turned loose an aerial assault on the Cameron squad. Simmons did not score by virtue of easy catches, however, but by pulling high passes out of the November sky.

Following the game, which Cameron won 39-34, Simmons was described by a Tulsa University coach as "the best junior college pass receiver I have ever seen." Mose Simms, Oklahoma City, and head of the Wigwam Wisemen of America, apparently agreed with the Tulsa coach, as a few days later he sent an invitation to Simmons to participate in the annual Shrine Junior College game at Albuquerque, New Mexico.

Simmons played with the winning team in the Shrine game, then left for Fort Polk, La., where he was to report to active duty in the Army.

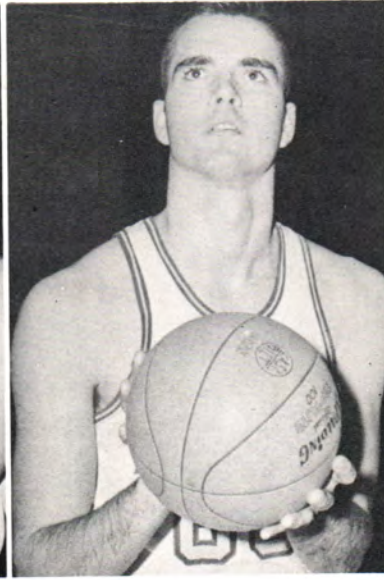




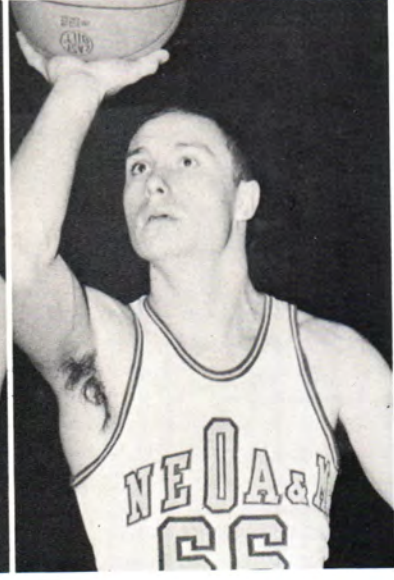

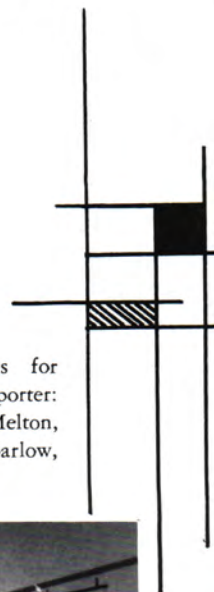

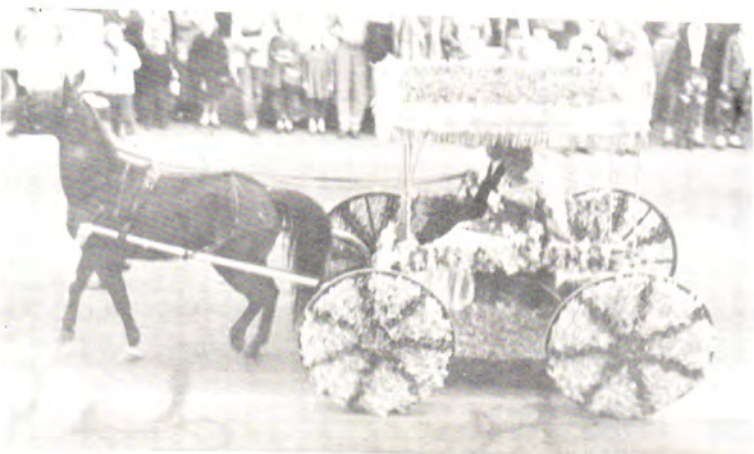
