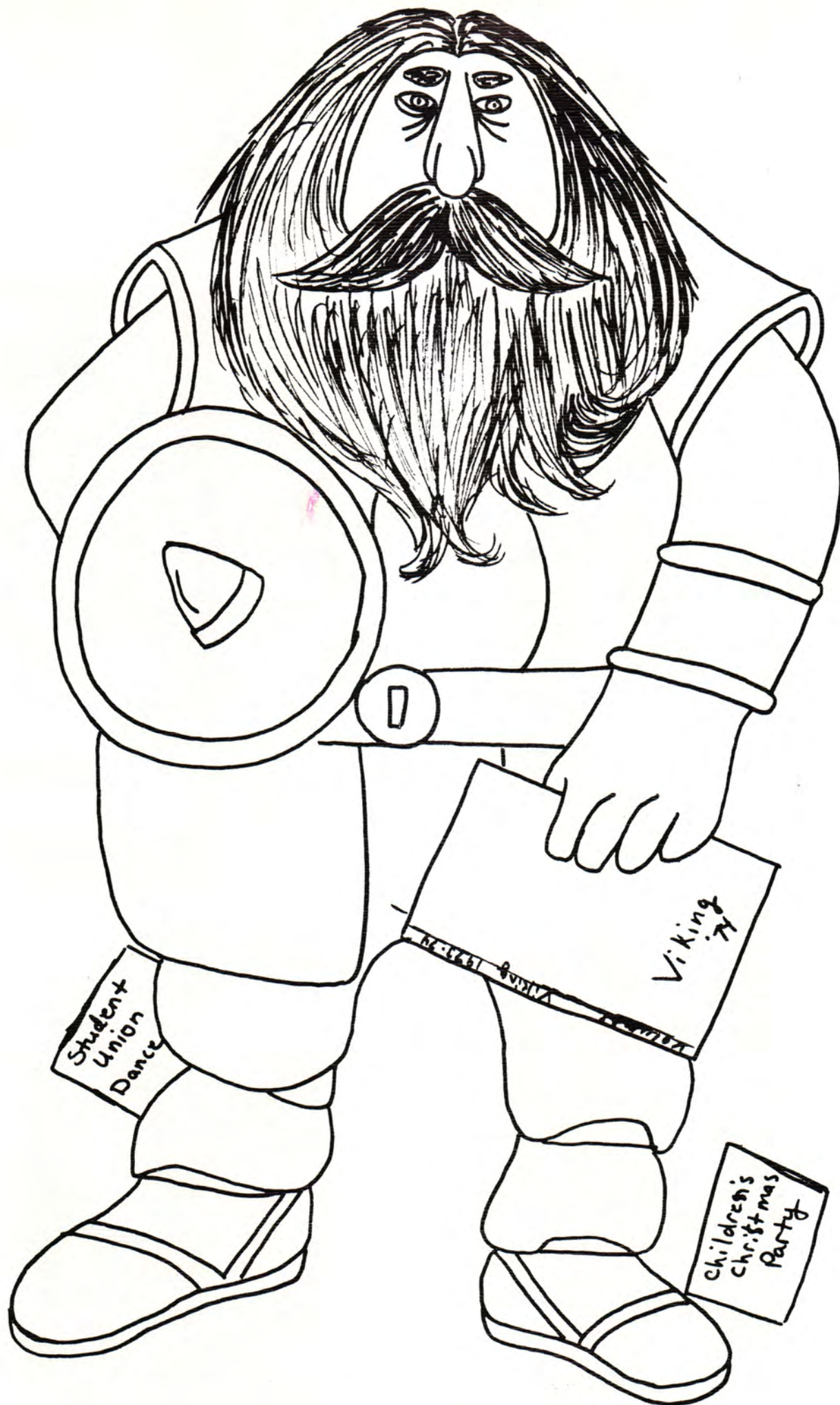

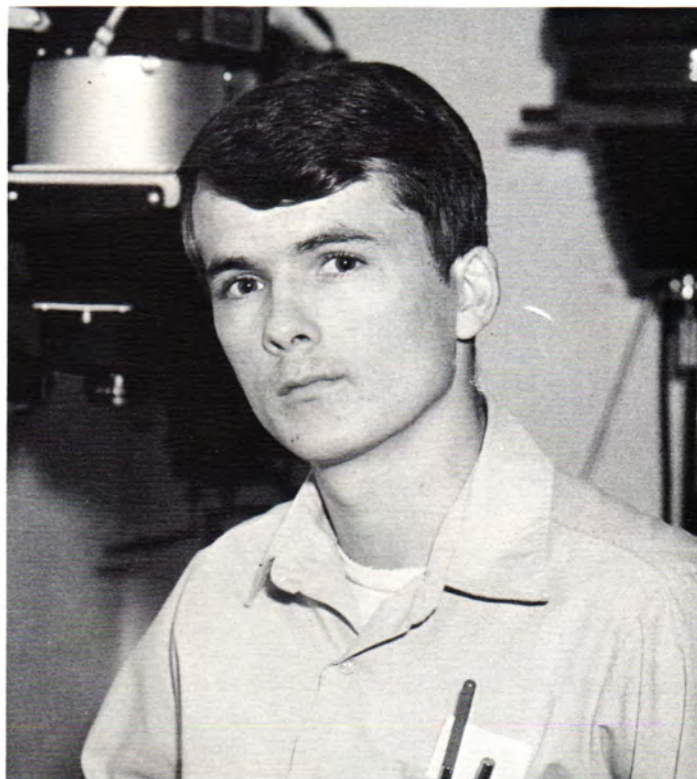

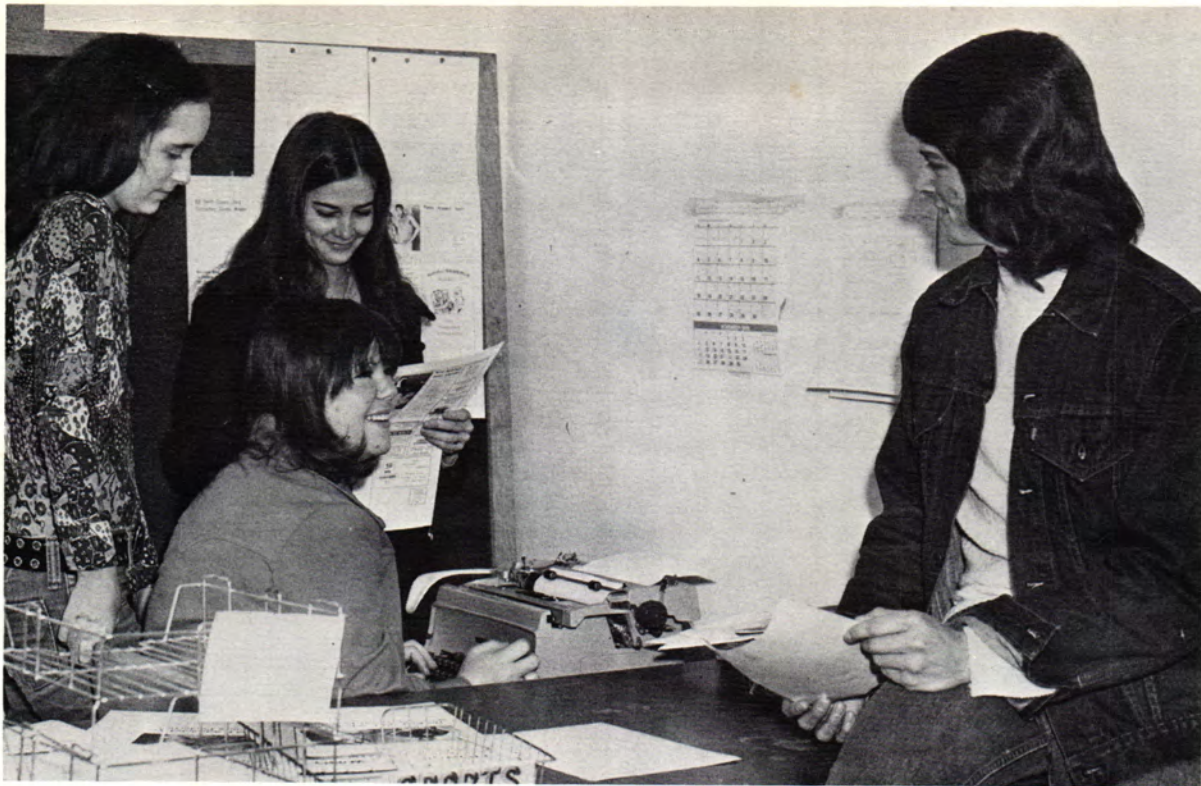

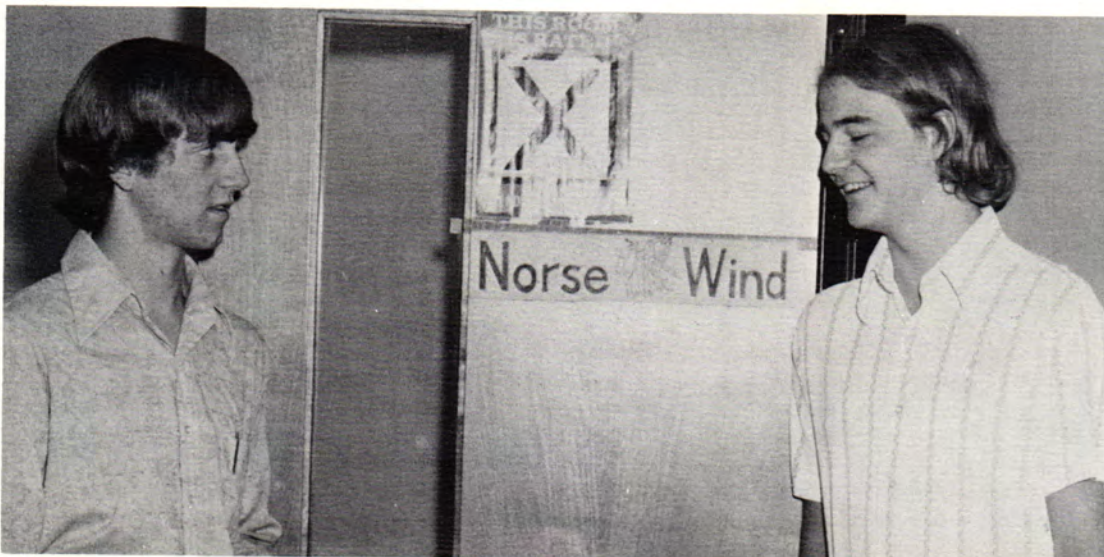

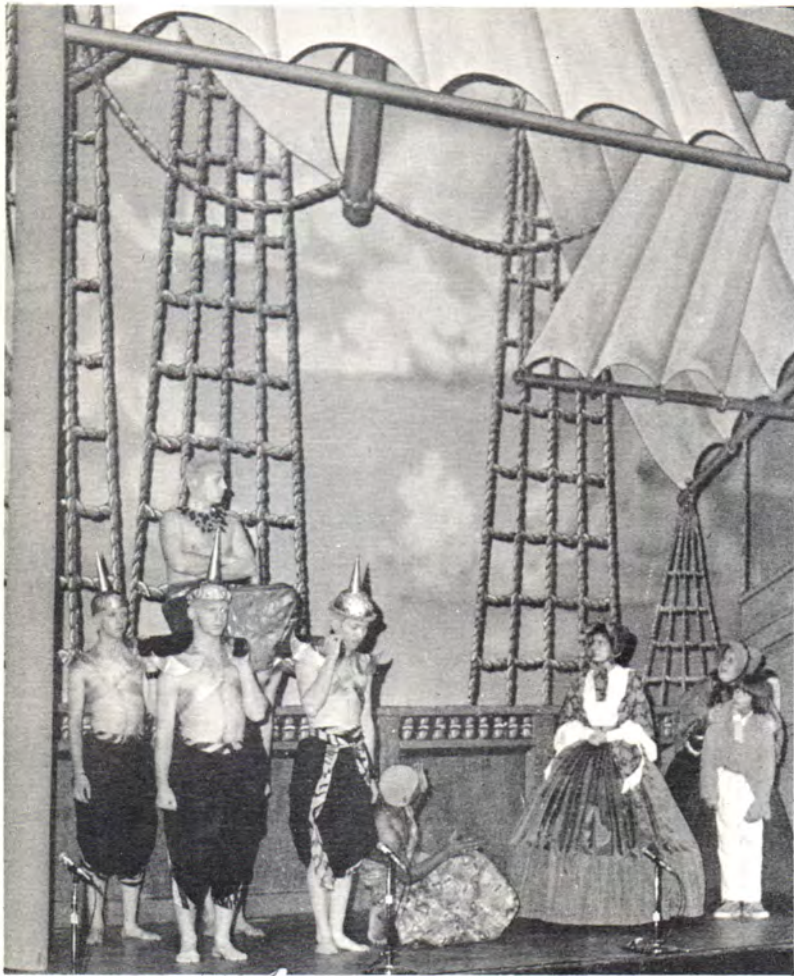




Drama Department

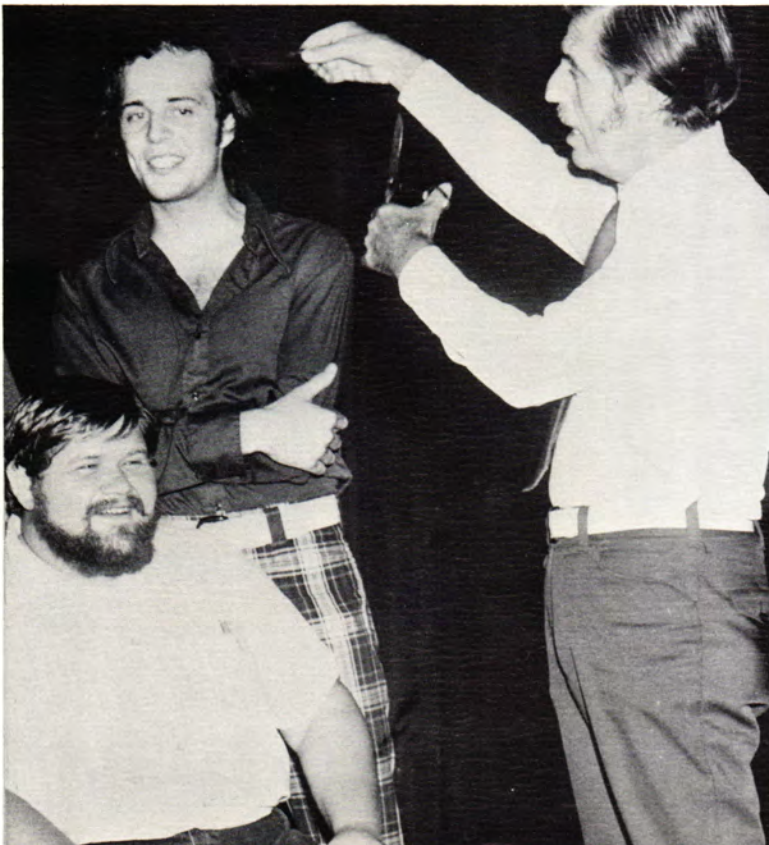

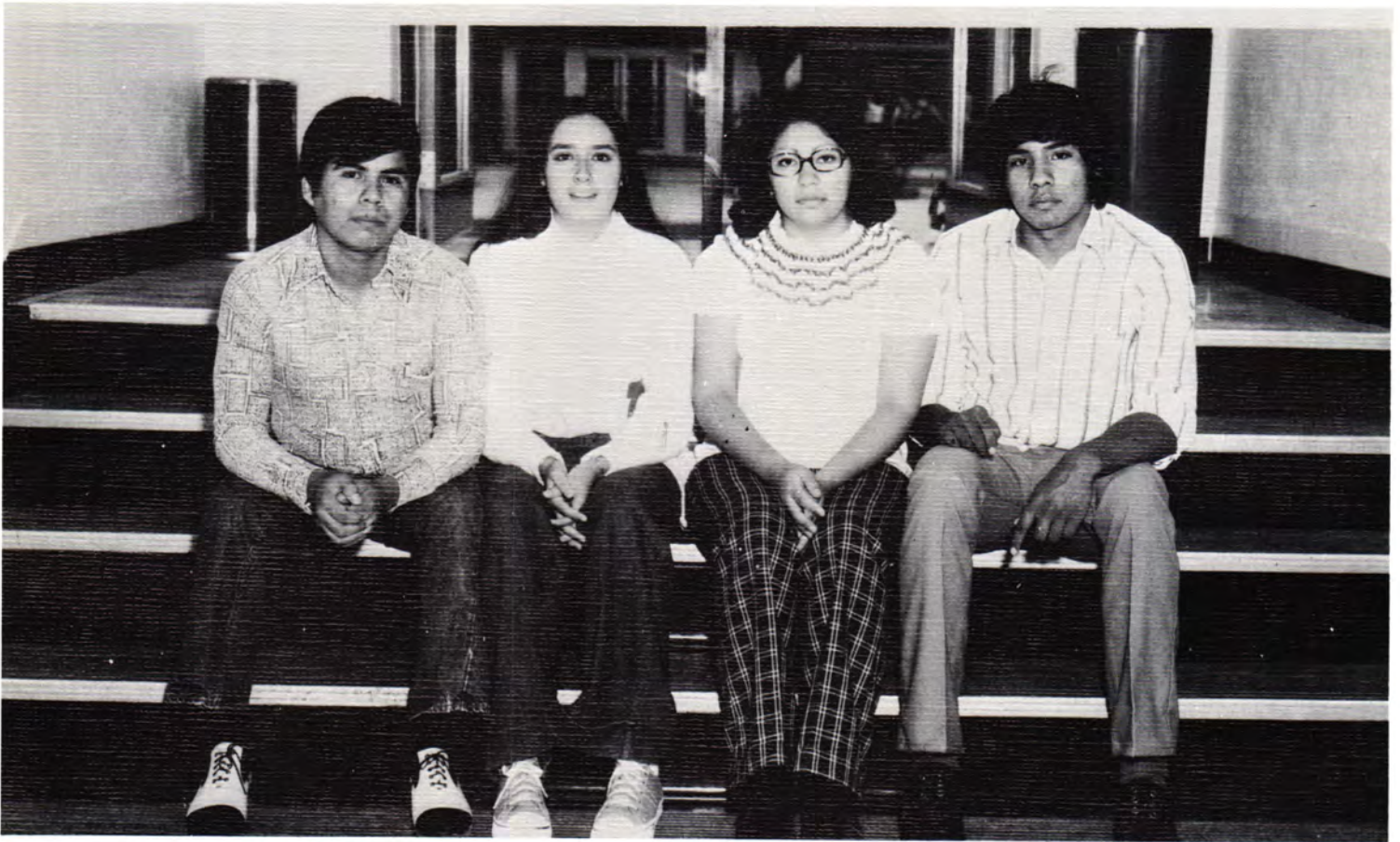

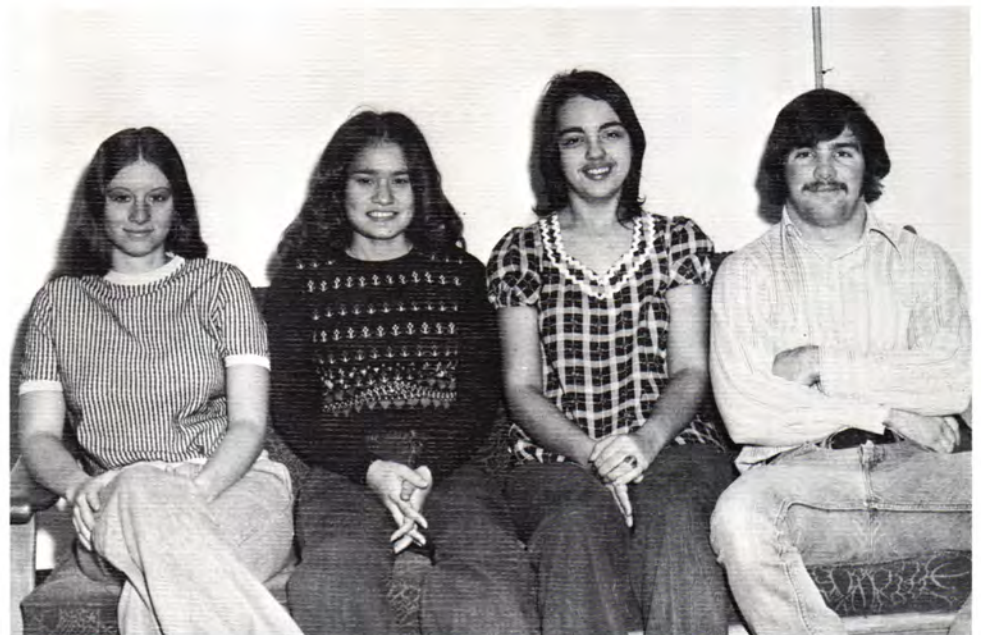

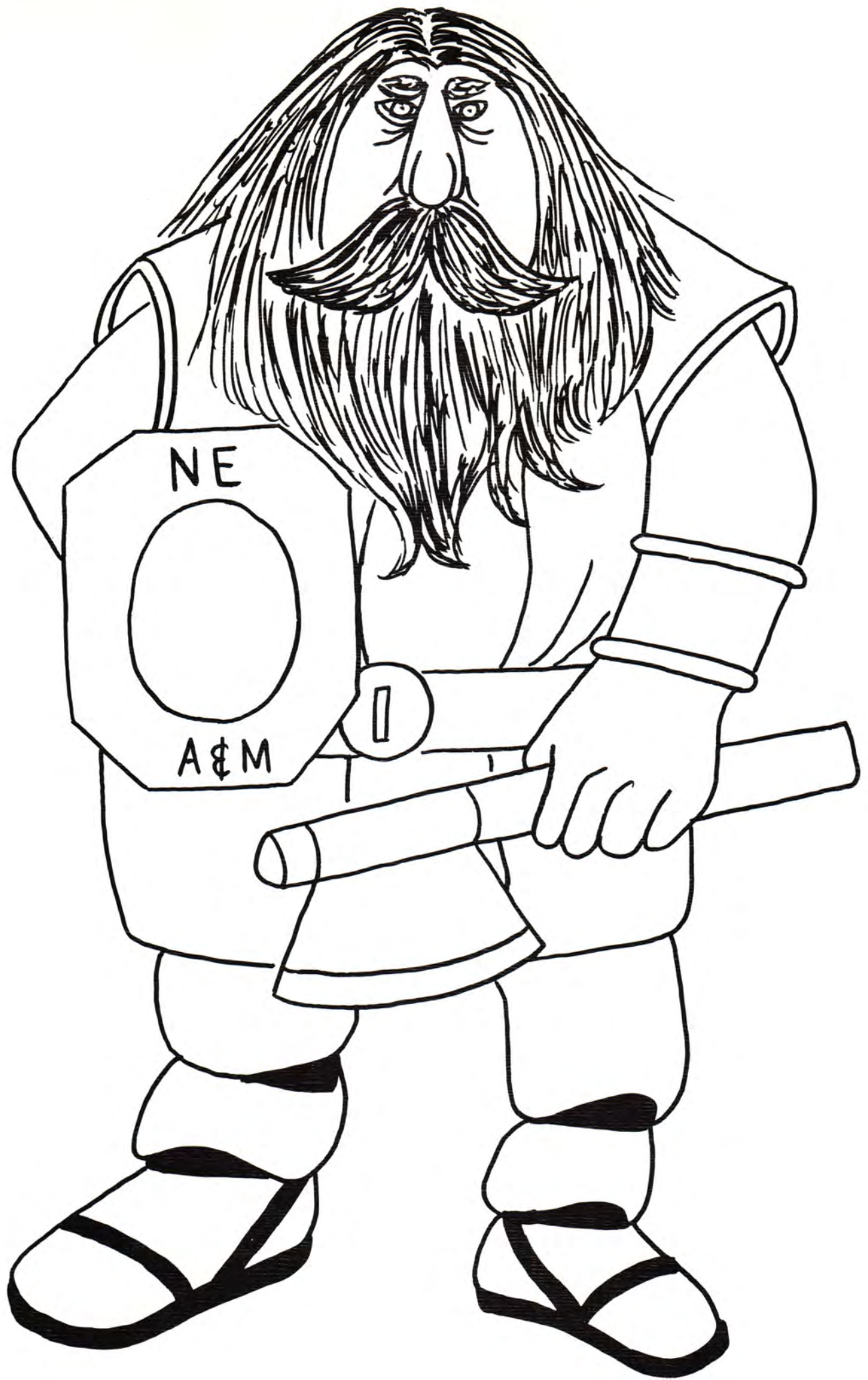

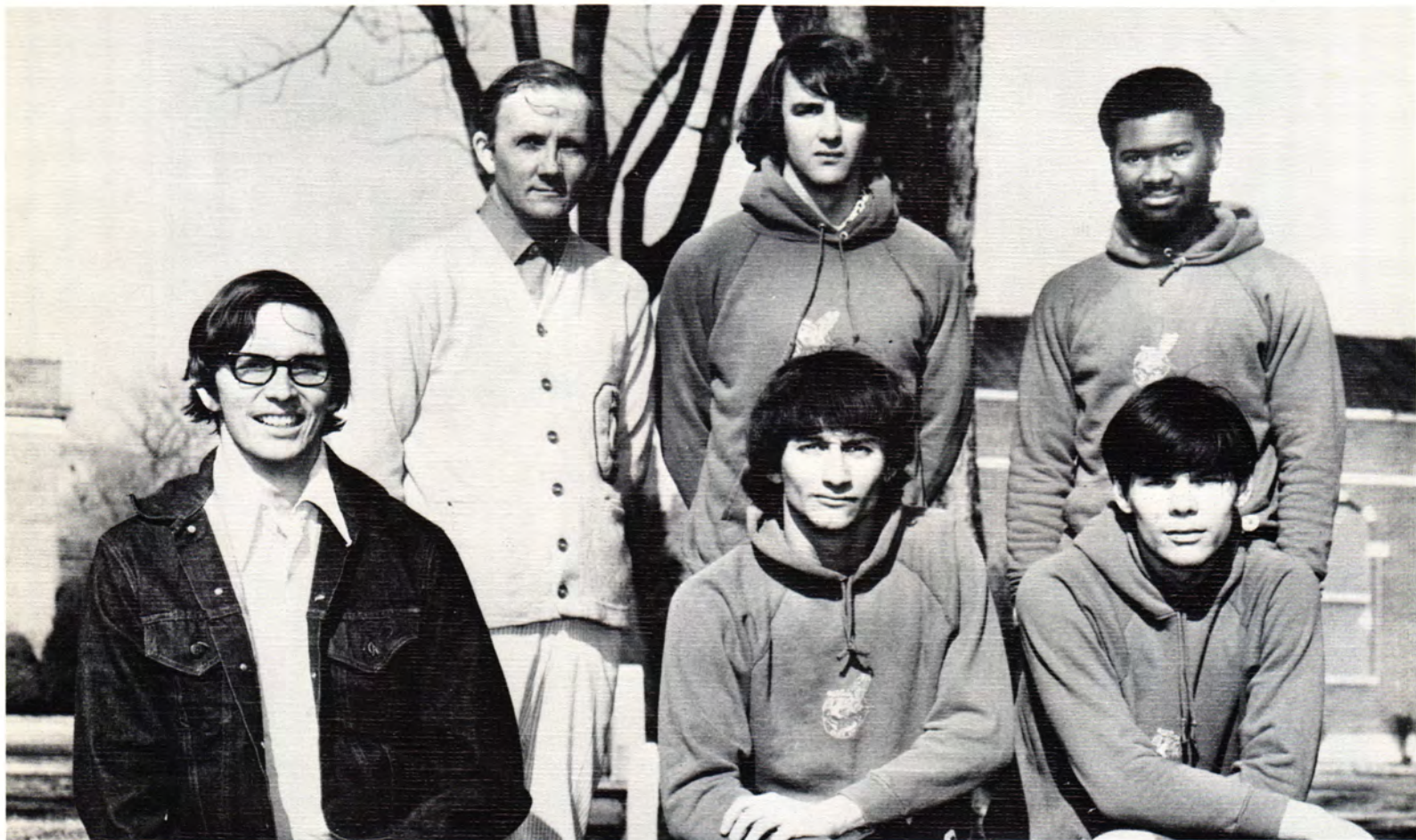

Signatures Autobiography

- 1) Of Mark Twain: He had lived exuberantly, nothing ever happening to him in a small way, his adventures invariably fraught with drama. He summed it up himself: while others toiled, he spent "a lifetime of delightful idleness"; for he lived so vigorously that work was indistinguishable from pleasure.
- 2) I used to remember my brother Henry walking into a fire outdoors when he was a week old. It was remarkable for me to remember a thing like that and still more remarkable that I should cling to the delusion for 30 yrs. That I did remember it - for of course it never happened, he would not have been able to walk at that age.
- 3) When I was younger I could remember anything, whether, it happened or not; but my faculties are decaying now and soon I shall be able to remember only the things that never happened. It is sad to go to pieces like this, but we all have to do it.
- 4) I would move a whole State if the exigencies of literature required it.
- 5) "General" Gainer, who was our first town drunkard before Jimmy Fungus at the place. (Sam Wynon, town marshall, was black snake whipped homeward everytime he got drunk, which was daily. My own (and by his squeaking little spouse.)
- 6) My own: his folks didn't get a day's work out of him until he was seven years old: Woody Painter.
- 7) And forgotten since came flocking out of the secret chambers of my memories.
- 8) Stole gingerbread from classmate after praying for it and confessed to his mother that he was a Christian for revenue only.
- 9) To have my truthfulness flung out of the market in this placid and confident way.
