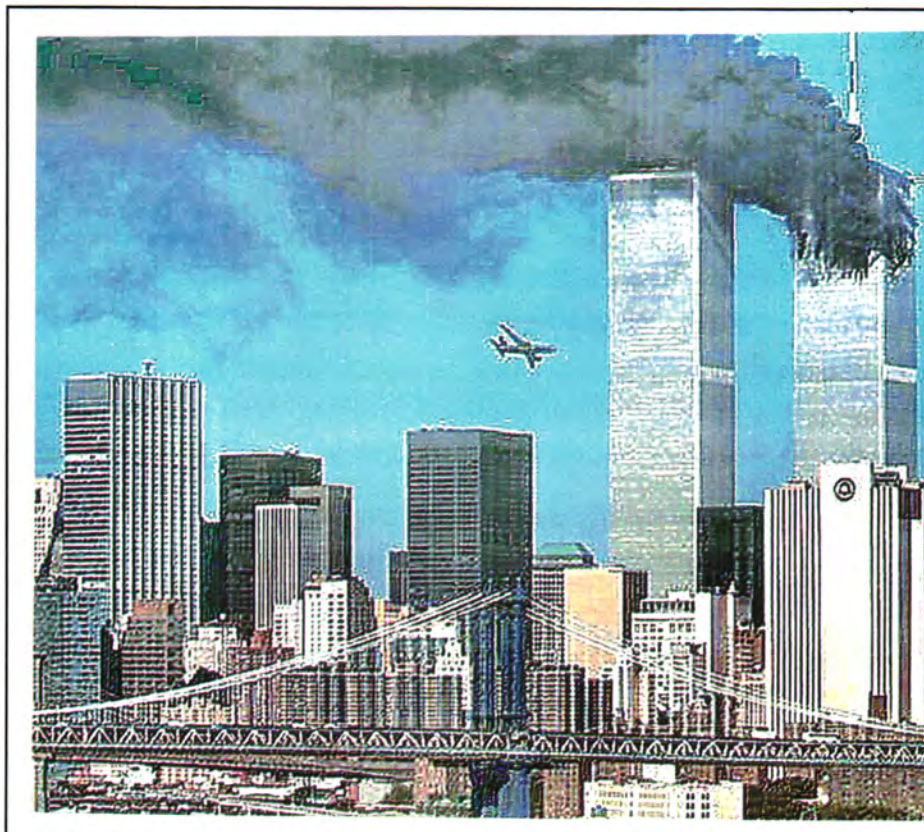

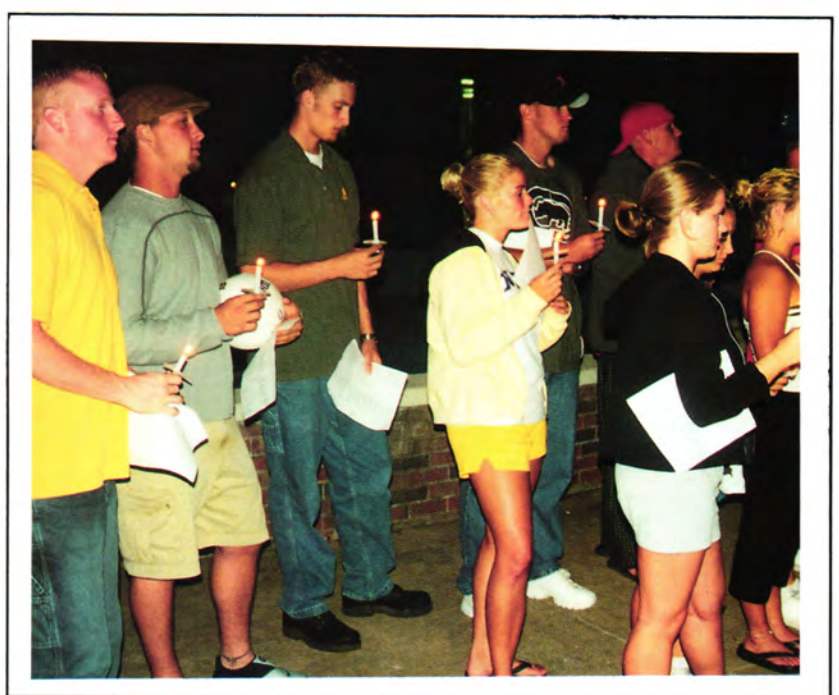

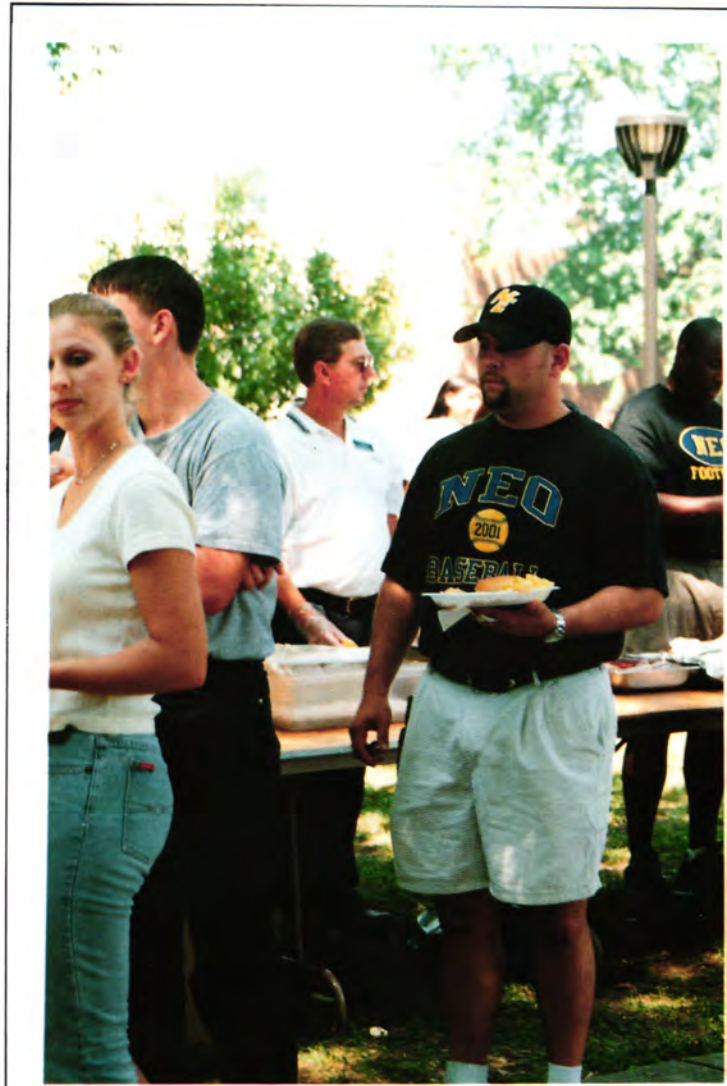

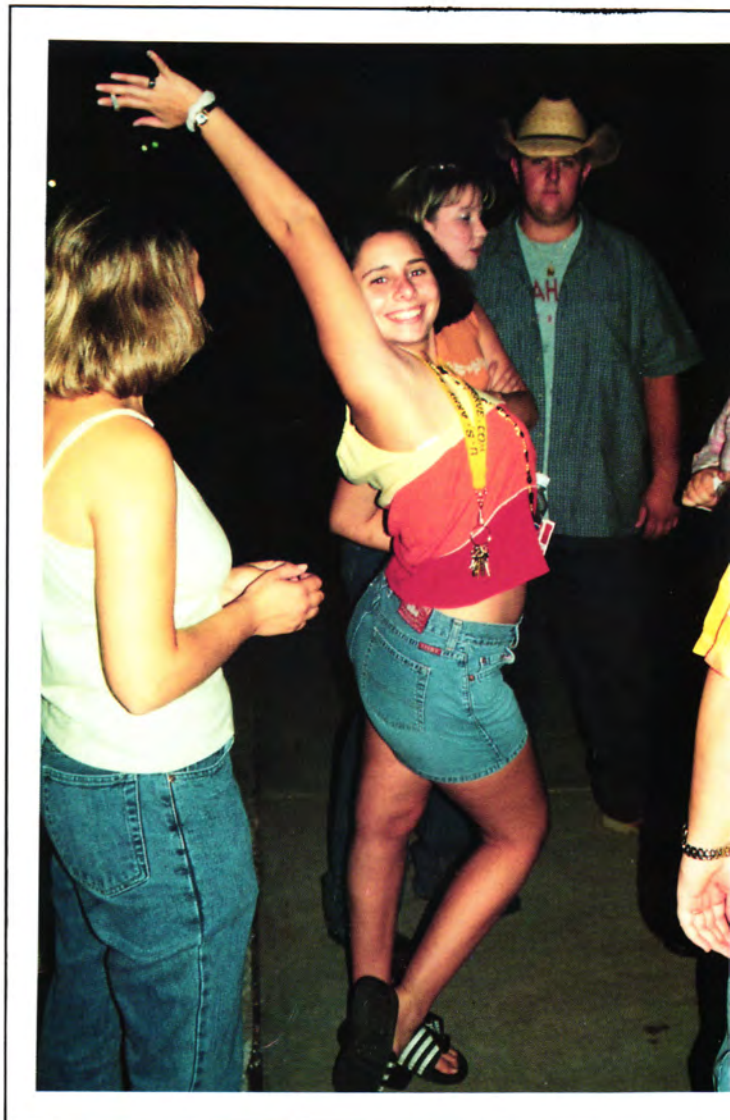

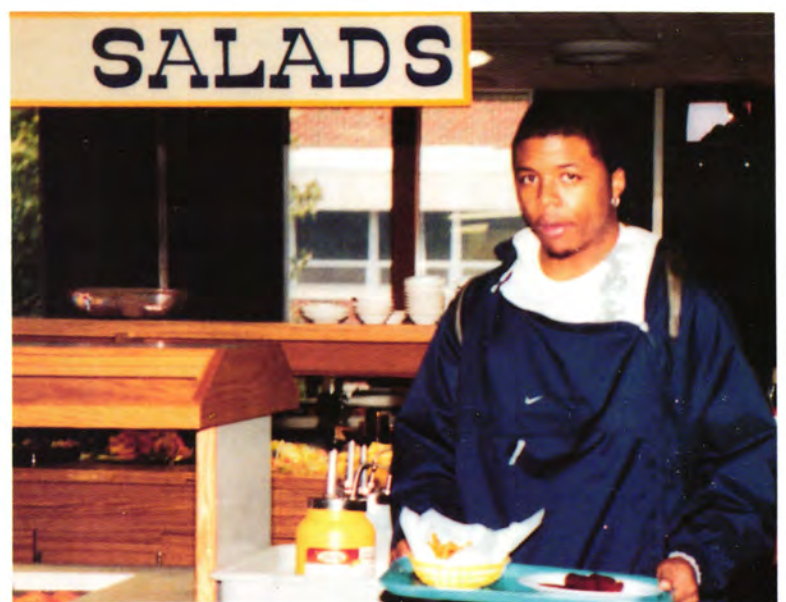

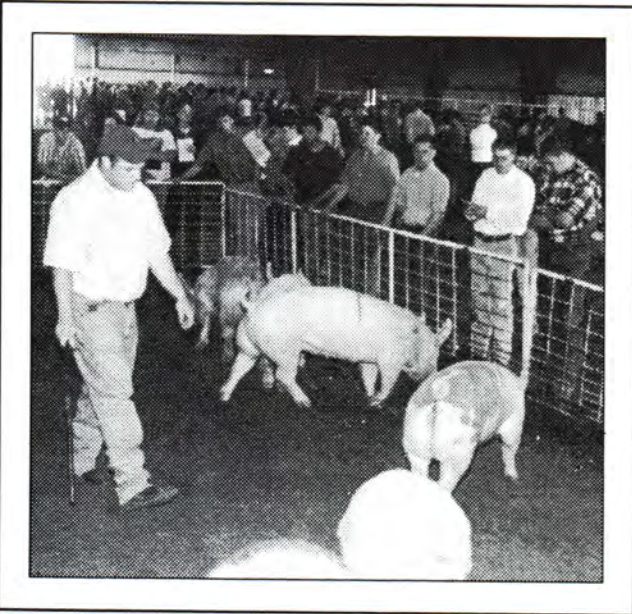
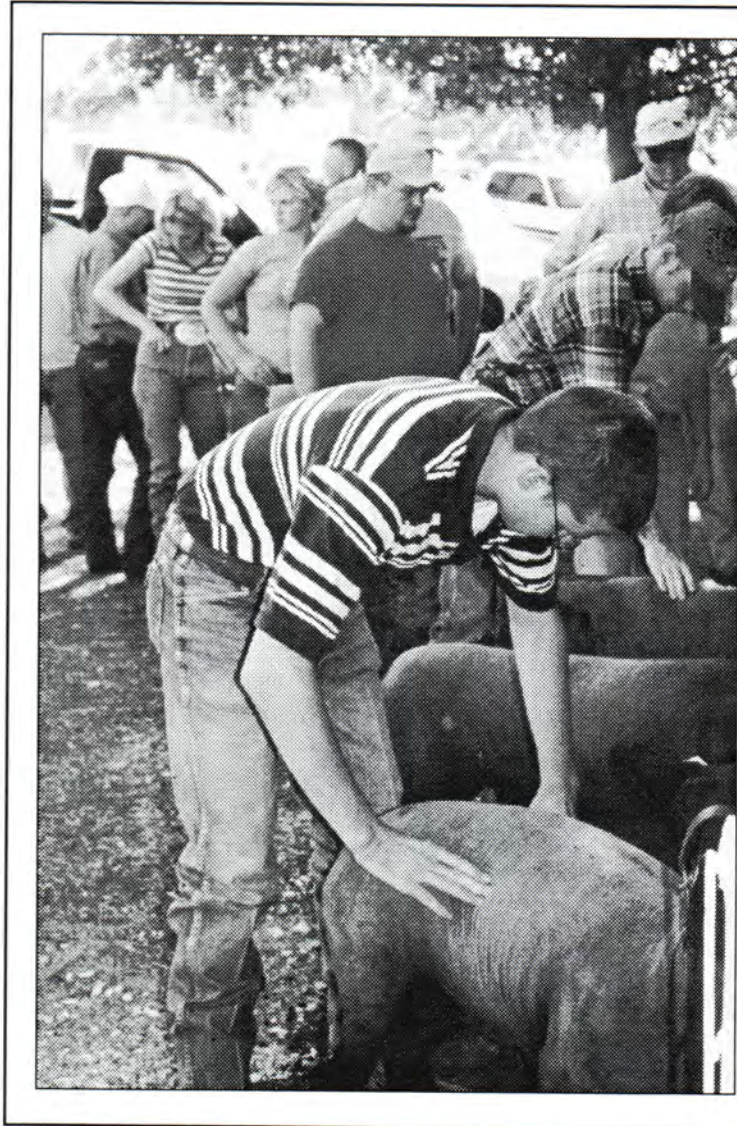

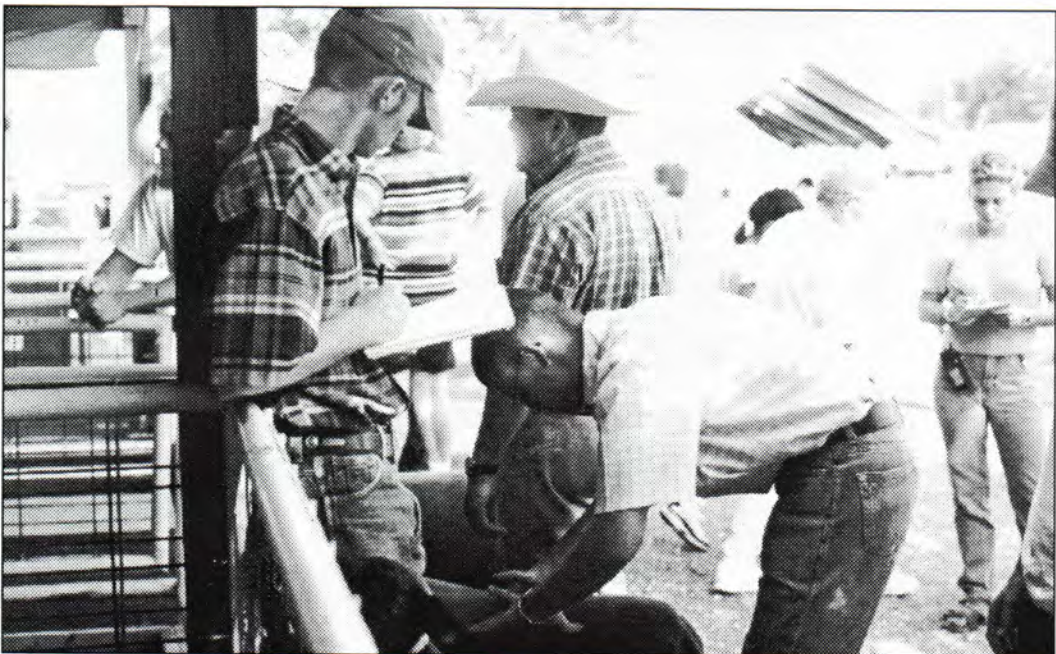

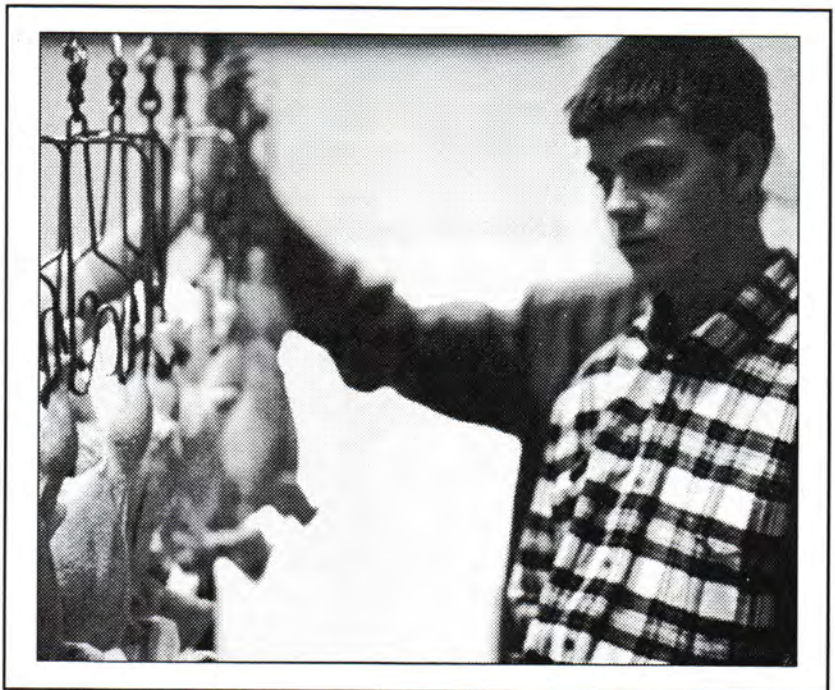

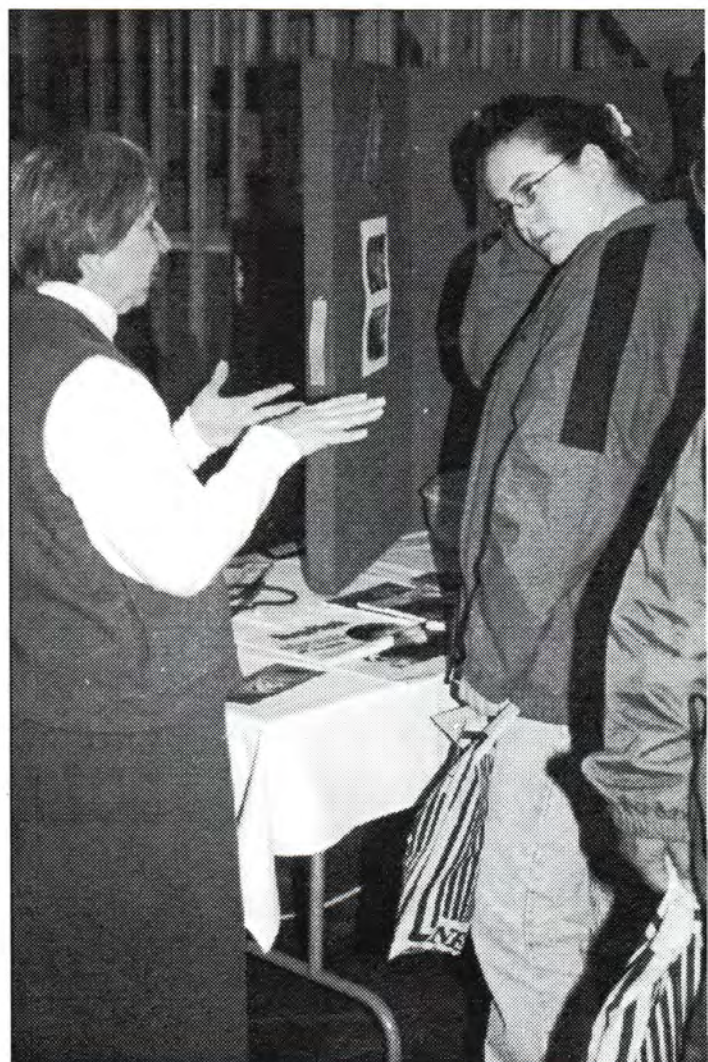

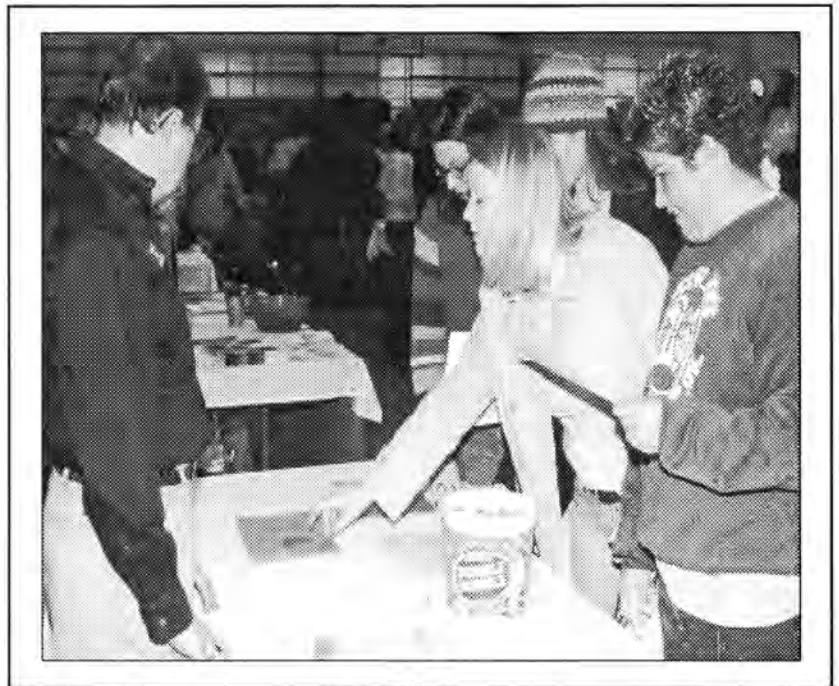
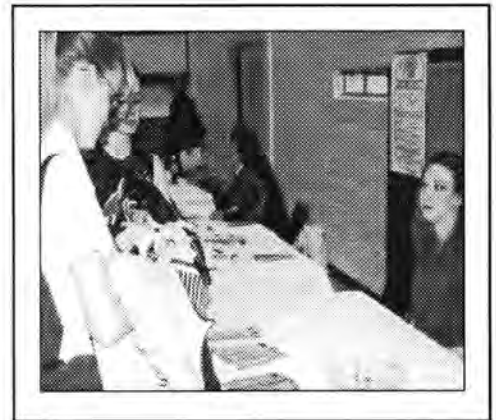

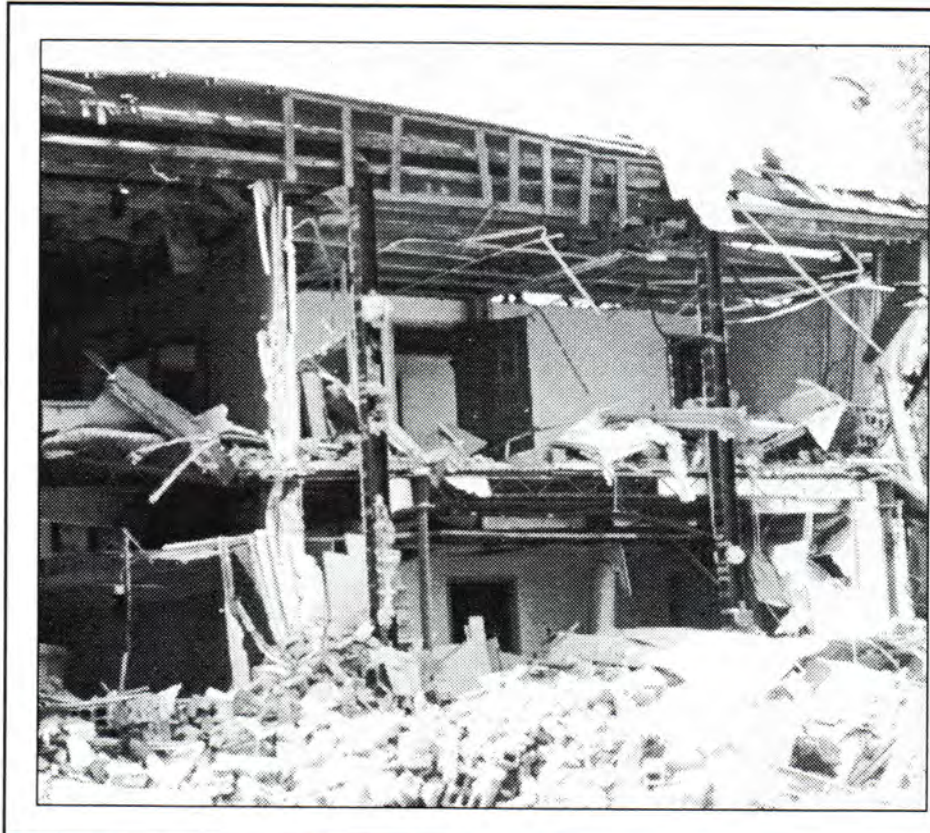

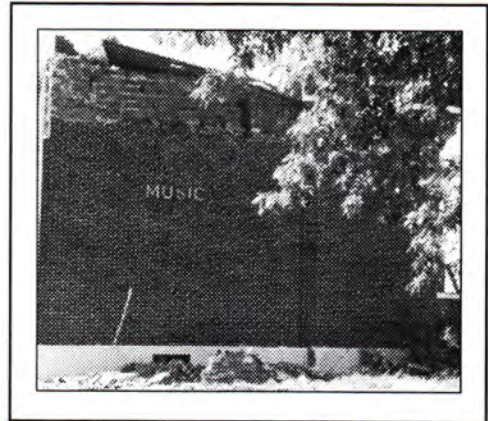

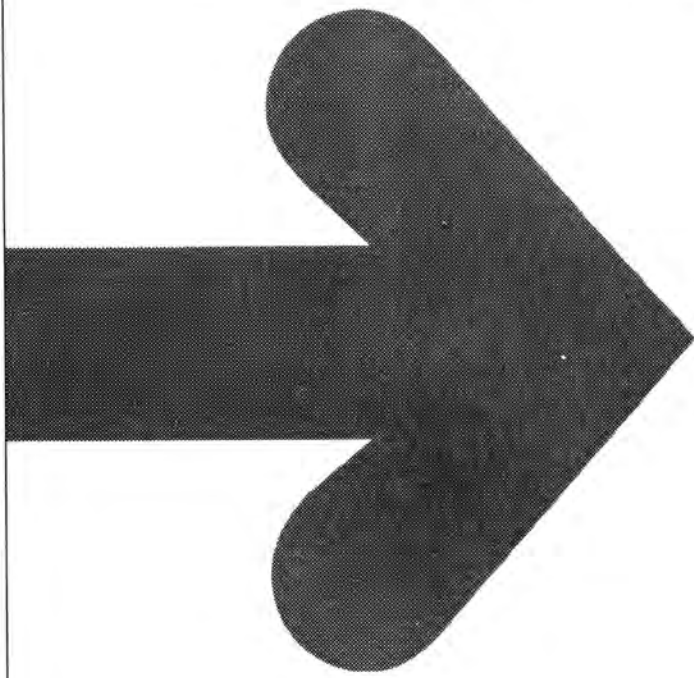

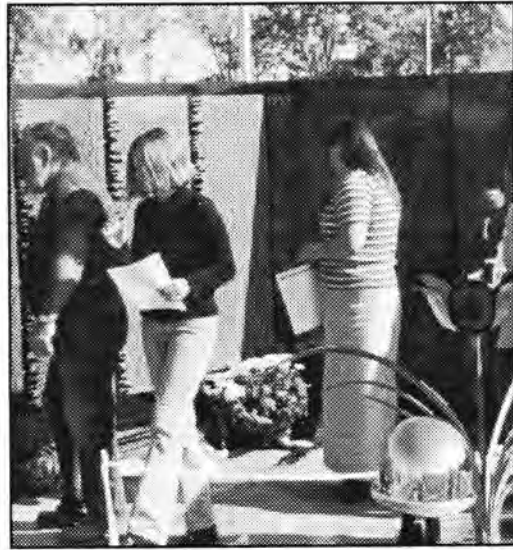

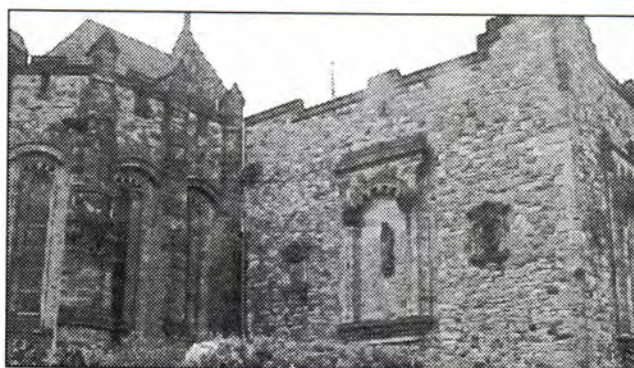

Dr. Glenn E. Mayle

Dr. Glenn E. Mayle entered his fourth year as president of Northeastern Oklahoma A&M College. His many initiatives included improving the quality and expansion of educational opportunities through the use of wireless technology, through capital improvements and through the development of intercollegiate athletics.

Under Dr. Mayle's guidance, NEO will complete transition from a token ring information system to wireless communications by January 2002. The transition will make instruction and Internet access possible from almost any remote site on campus. In addition, NEO will continue to utilize instructional television, interactive videoconferencing and the World Wide Web to increase course offerings.

The college has also entered a baccalaureate degree program with Northeastern State University, Tahlequah, and a master degree program with Oklahoma State University, Stillwater. These two programs, which utilize distance learning technology, allow area students to continue their education beyond the associate degree level without commuting to other campuses.

In addition, Dr. Mayle has initiated several campus renovation projects. The college gymnasium facility received an up-graded air conditioning system, expanded restroom facilities, a new gym floor and new ceiling tiles. Five residential dormitories and four student housing units received new paint, furniture, fixtures and additional computers for study areas and more security lights have been added

throughout the campus.

Demolition of NEO's Intramural Gym/Music Hall building, which was destroyed by fire last year, has also been completed. Plans are underway for new construction to replace the original structure.

Dr. Mayle is very active in the development of the Southwest Junior College Football Conference. He continues to ensure that NEO intercollegiate athletics are funded competitively with other conference member schools.

Dr. Mayle began his administrative career as Chief Academic Officer and Dean of Instruction at Arizona

Western College, Yuma, Ariz. While there, he also served a brief time as athletic director.

He then served eight years as president of Treasure Valley Community College, Ontario, Oregon. He also served five years as president of Gavilan Valley Community College, Gilroy, Calif.

Dr. Mayle earned a bachelor of science degree from Arizona State College in Tempe. He received a master of arts degree from Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff. He earned a doctorate in educational administration from Northern Arizona.



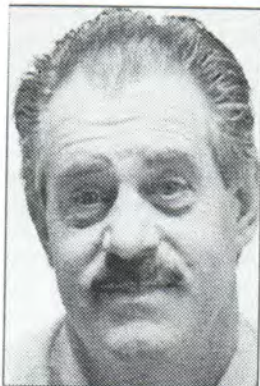

er information specialists, drafting and design, electronics, electronic engineering, electromechanical, golf course management or metal fabrication.

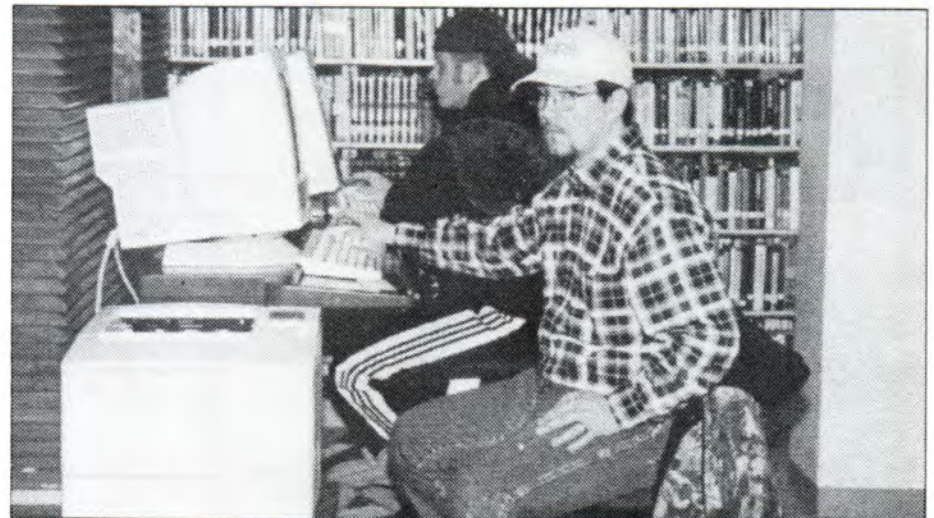
Each department also offers numerous one or two-year academic certificate programs.

Harris gained 149 yards as the Golden Norse ground game accumulated 289 yards compared to only 70 by the Red Ravens.

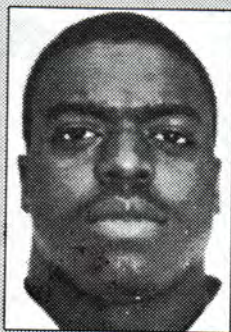
Returning home to Robertson

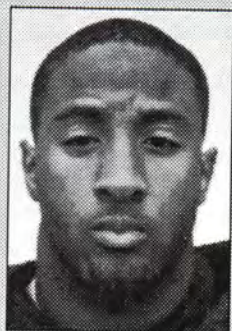

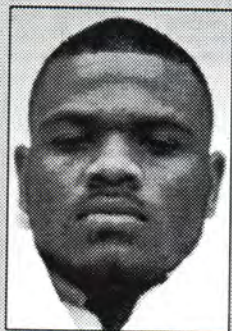

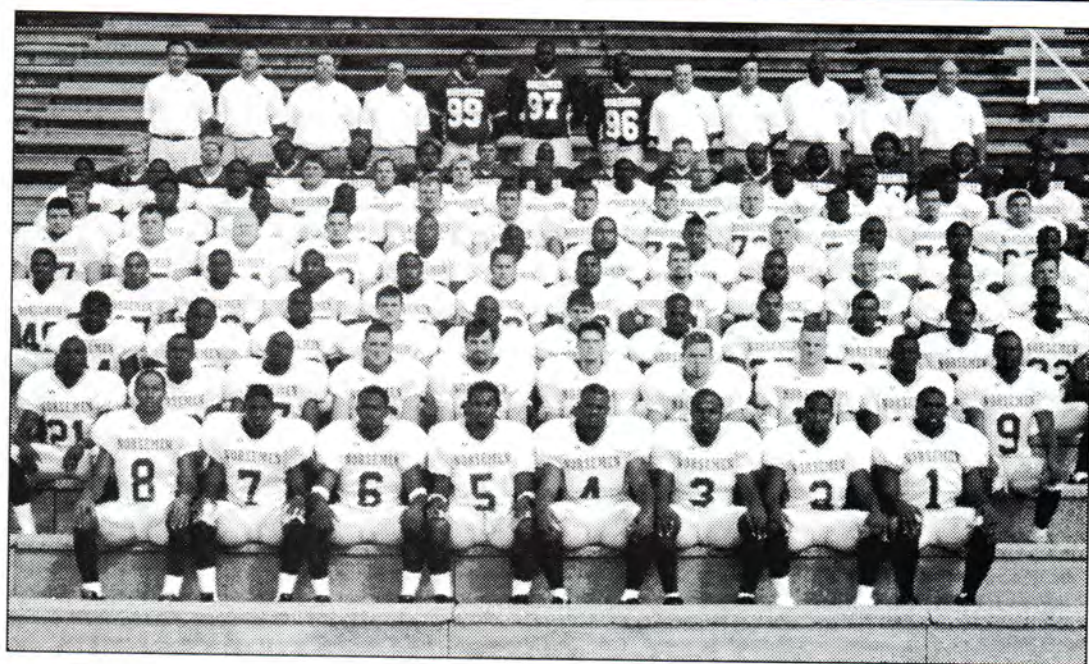

CONFERENCE STARTS

Two field goals of 43 yards and 32 yards by Tyler Wilkey along with touchdown runs of 2 and 3 yards by Johnny Bizzell carried the Golden Norse to a 34-13 victory over the Greyhounds in Fort Scott, Kan., to conclude the non-conference portion of the schedule.

Touchdown runs of 7 yards by Terrell Harris and 4 yards by Mario Hain closed out NEO's scoring.

The Golden Norse generated 360 yards in total offense while the

defensive unit limited the Greyhounds to 206 total yards. Freshman quarterback Justin Southerland completed 8 of 16 passes for 162 yards while tight end Brandon Hill had three catches for 54 yards.

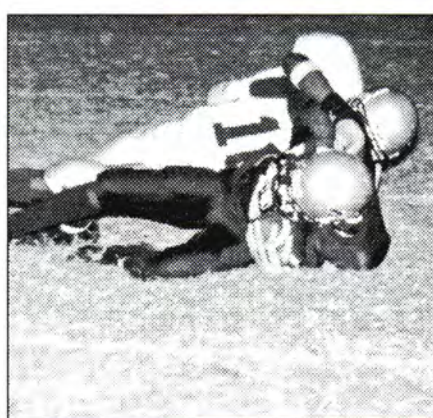
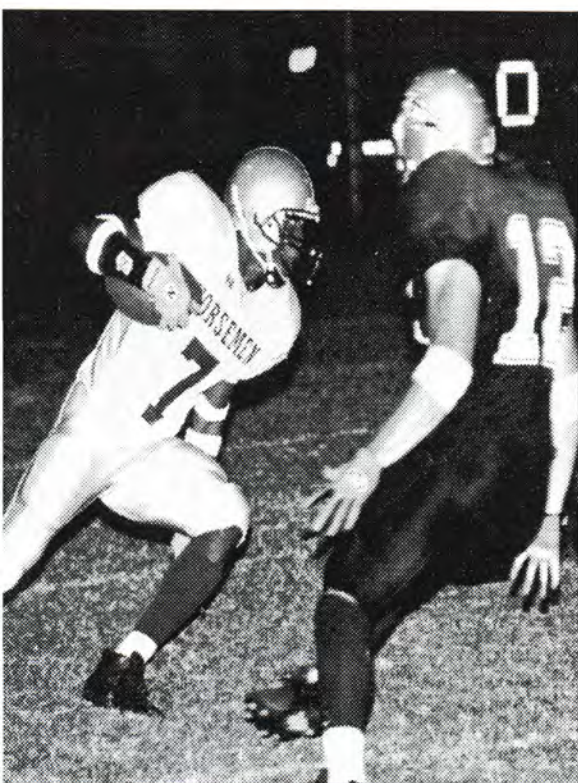

Following the loss to 10th-ranked Tyler, the Golden Norse returned to Robertson Field to host Trinity Valley in the traditional Homecoming game.

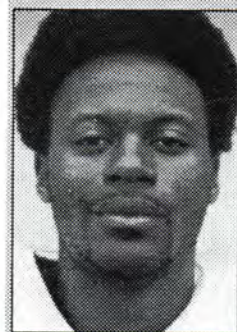

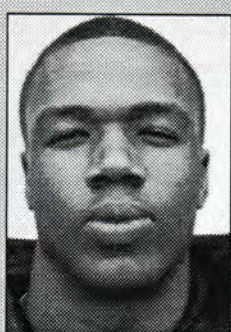

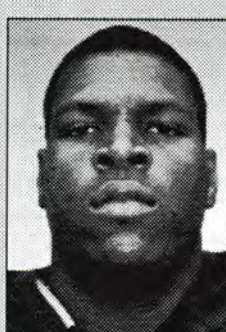

Shockingly, one week earlier the Norse closed out the regular season with a 48-16 rout over Blinn College at Robertson Field.

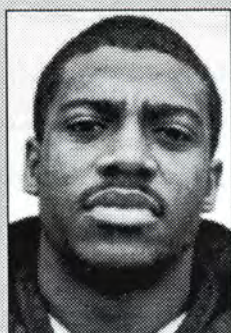
With field goals of 28 and 22 yards, Norse placekicker Tyler Wilkey set a conference record with 11 fields on the season.

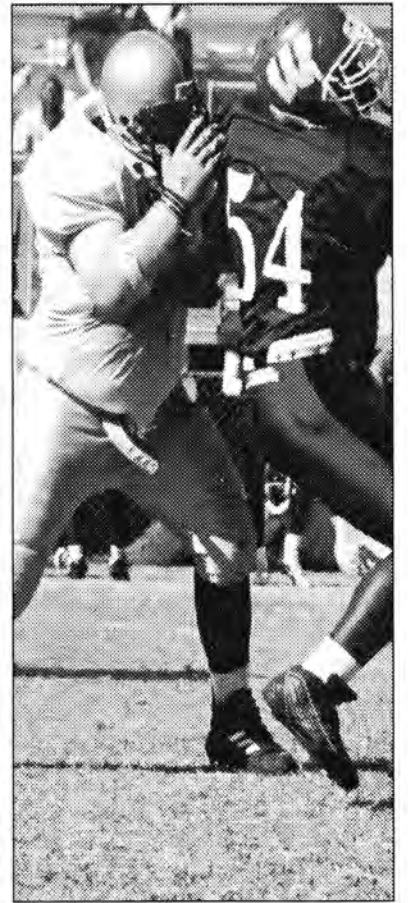

the entire tournament."

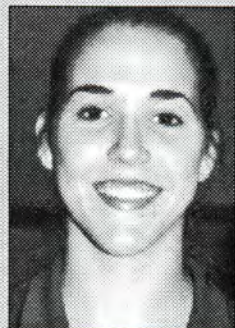
Arizona Western won the first game 30-23. NEO rallied from a 14-9 deficit in the second game to earn a 30-26 victory.

Three blocks and a kill at the net for Cunha in the fifth game enabled the Lady Norse to gain a 15-11 victory.

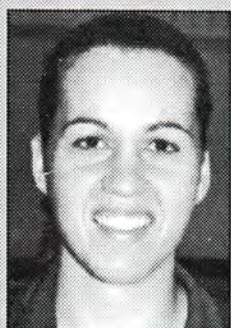

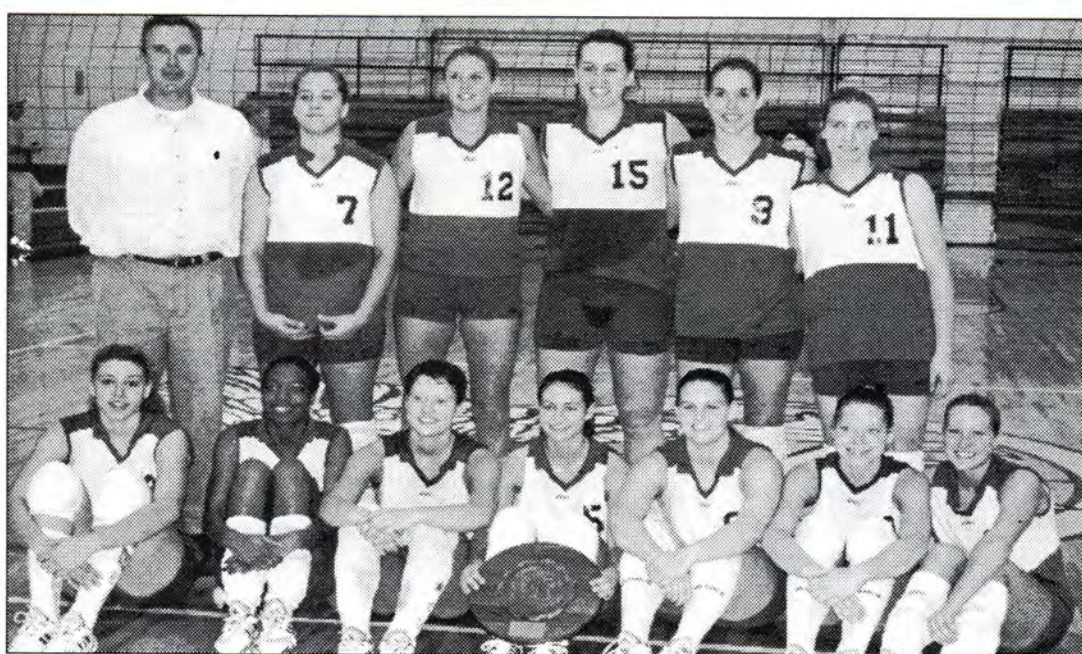

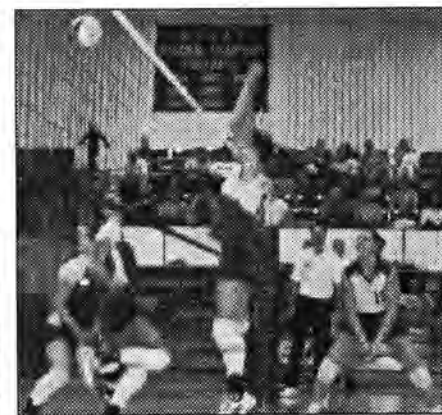

"We wanted to have a new coach

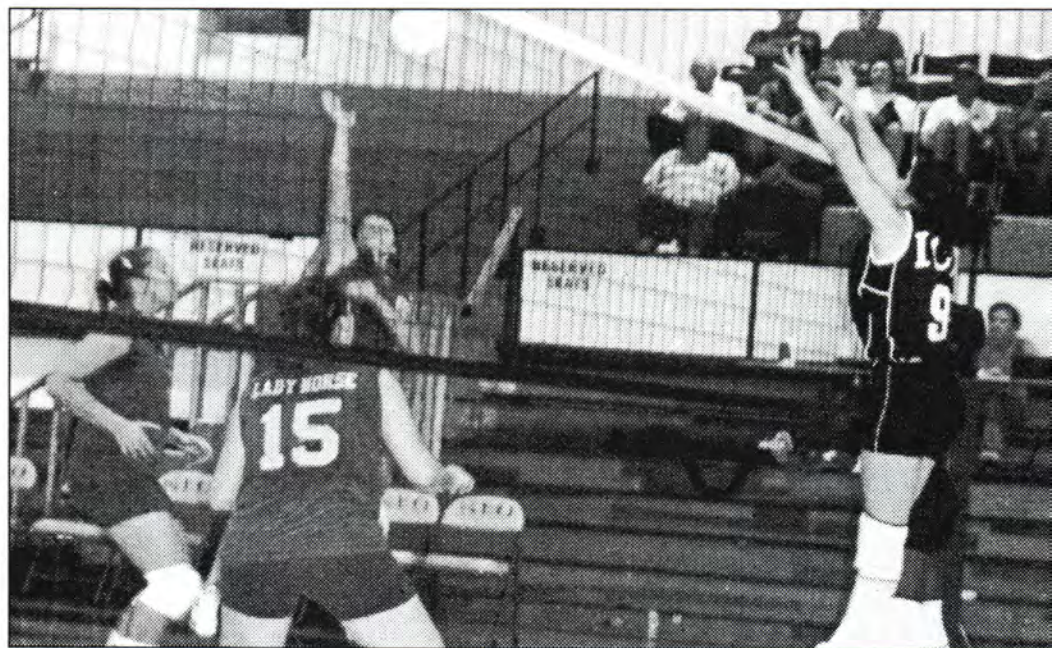
in place before the start of recruiting," said interim athletic director Mike Barlow. Barlow had served as interim head coach of the volleyball team the final two months of the regular season.

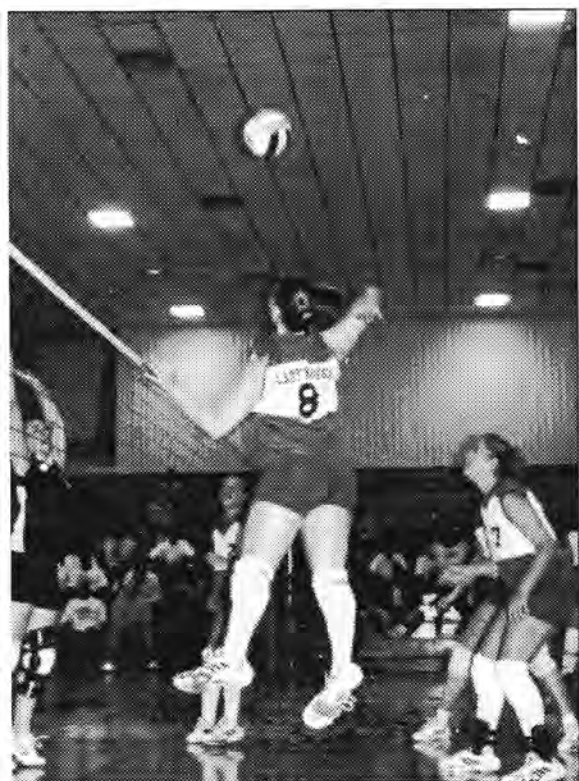

Traveling to Arkansas City, Kan., the Norsemen received 21 points from Daniels to defeat the Cowley County Tigers 70-59 in the second game of the year.

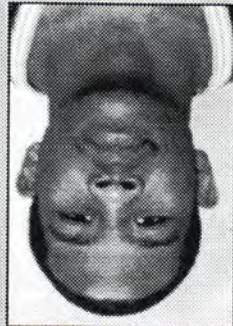

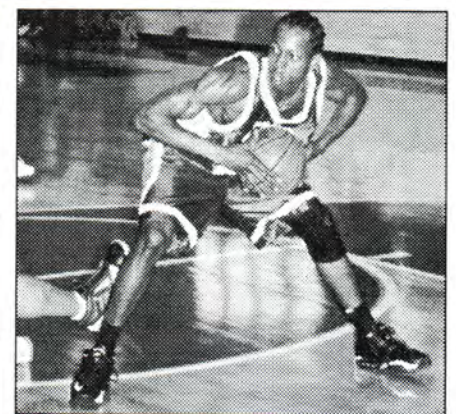

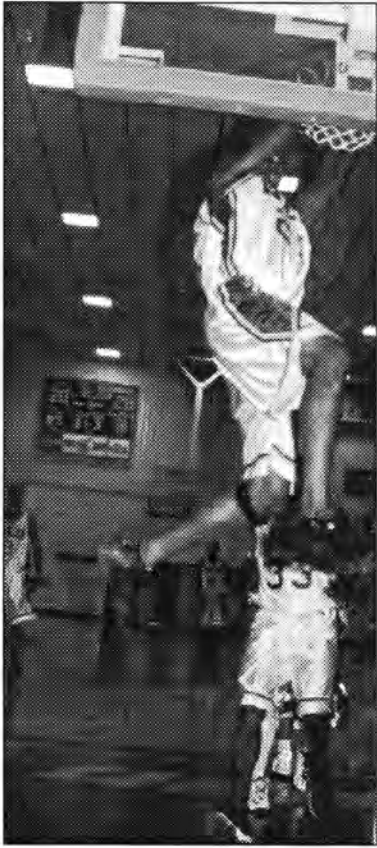

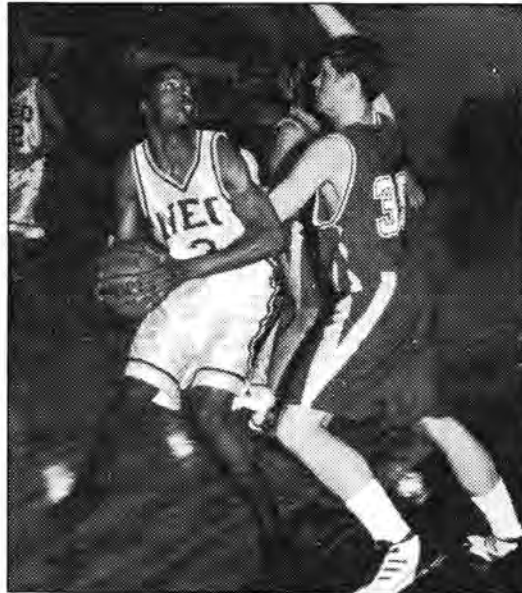

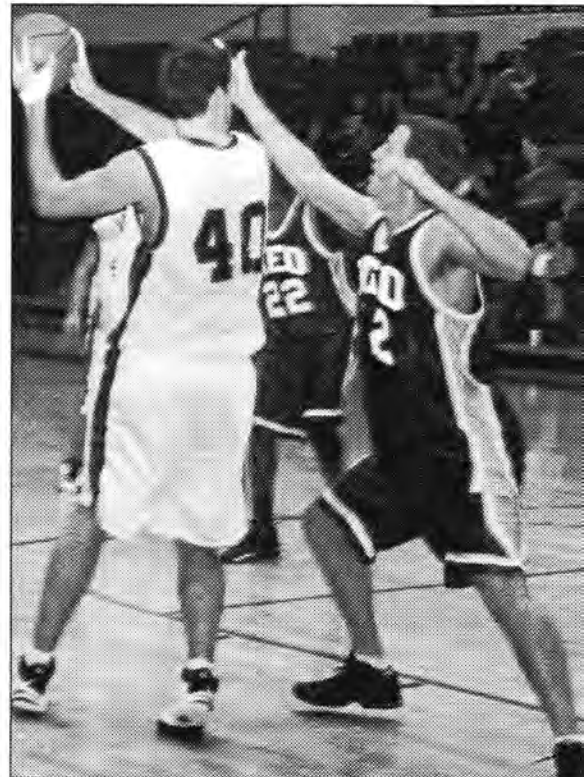

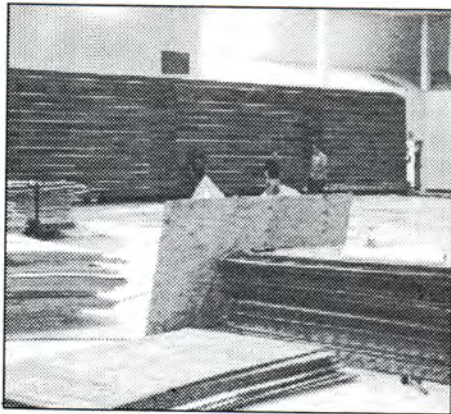

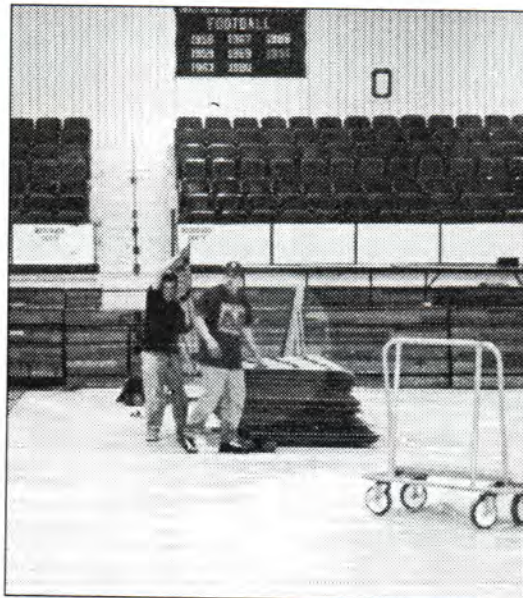

"My resignation was in the best

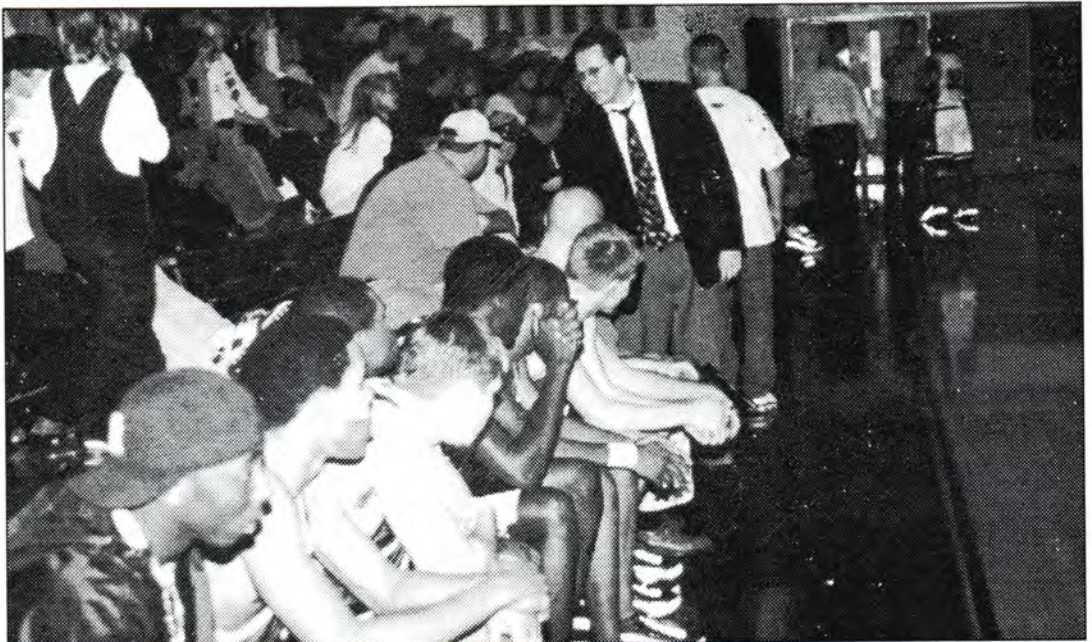
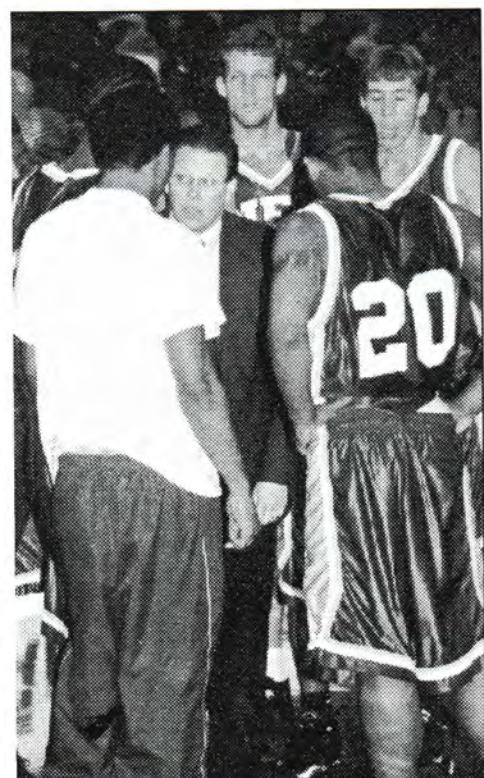
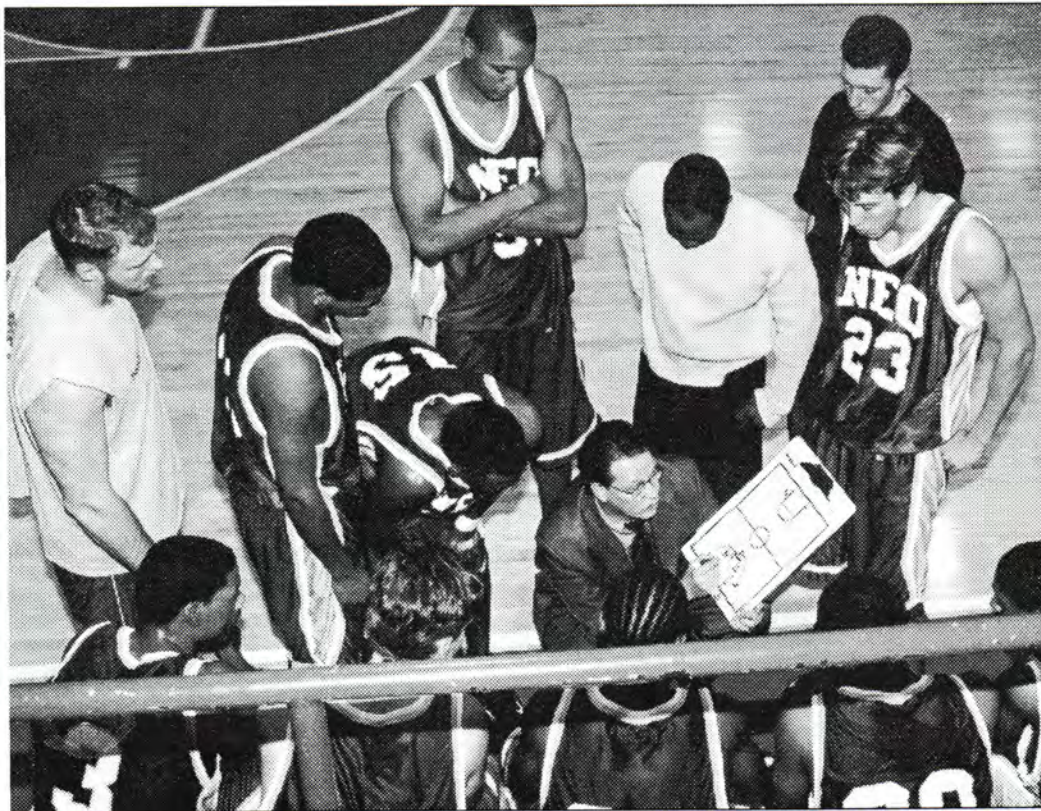
interest of the program. Over the last 14 years NEO had been very good to me and my family and I feel like this decision was in the best interest for everyone concerned," said Spencer.

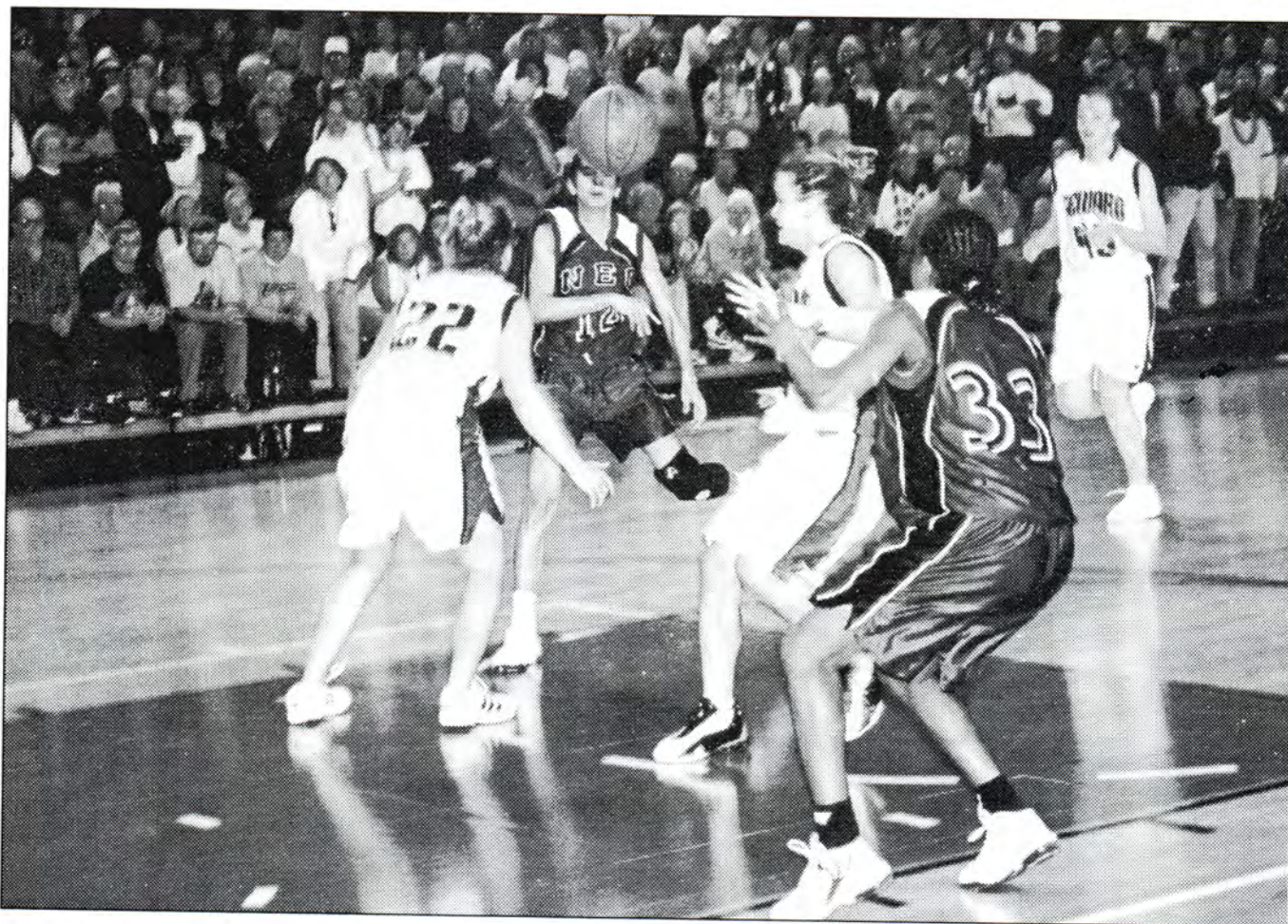

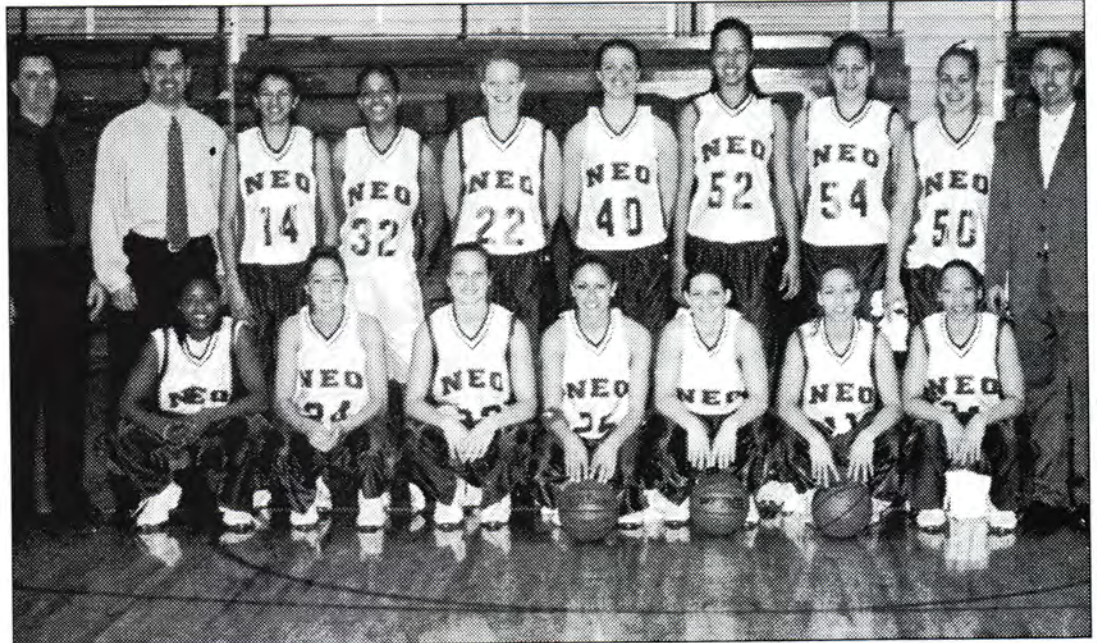
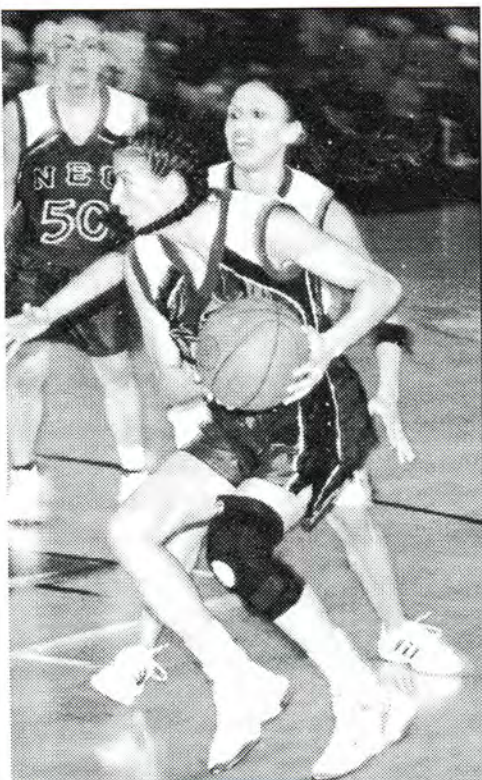

Solid play from the inside post people and accurate shooting from the perimeter carried the Lady Norse to their second Region II Tournament title in the last three years with a 77-55 victory over Carl Albert State College in the Noble Complex at Oklahoma Baptist University in Shawnee.

Living up to their number one ranking by the National Junior College Athletic Association the Lady Norse won their 32nd consecutive game.

"There are few things in life like Christmas or Easter that actually meet a person's expectations, but an athletic accomplishment like this far exceeds a coach's expectations. Then, to win two in the last three years is really great," said Lady Norse head coach B.J. Smith.

The Lady Norse advanced to the title game with a 87-60 win over Seminole State in the semifinal. Shelford led NEO with 18 points and 10 rebounds.

Facing the Lady Jets of North Oklahoma/Enid in the first round the Lady Norse received 18 points from Villarroel to gain a 81-58 win.

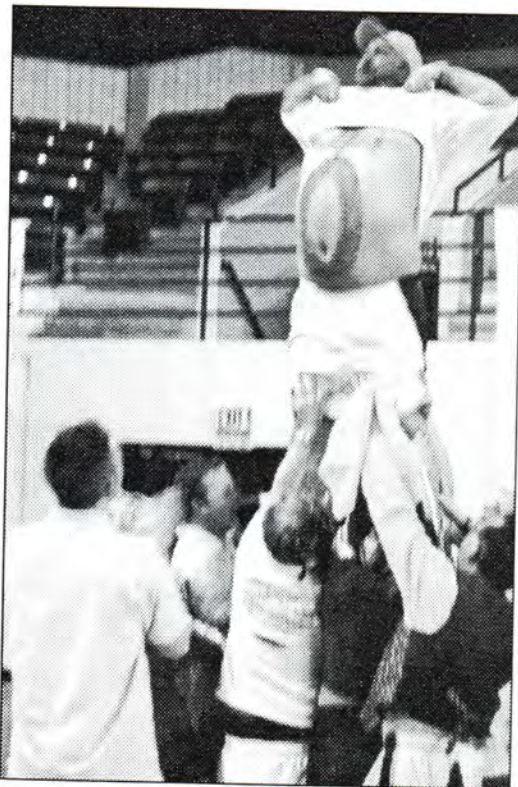

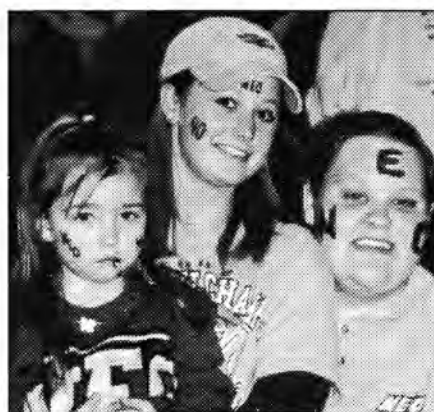

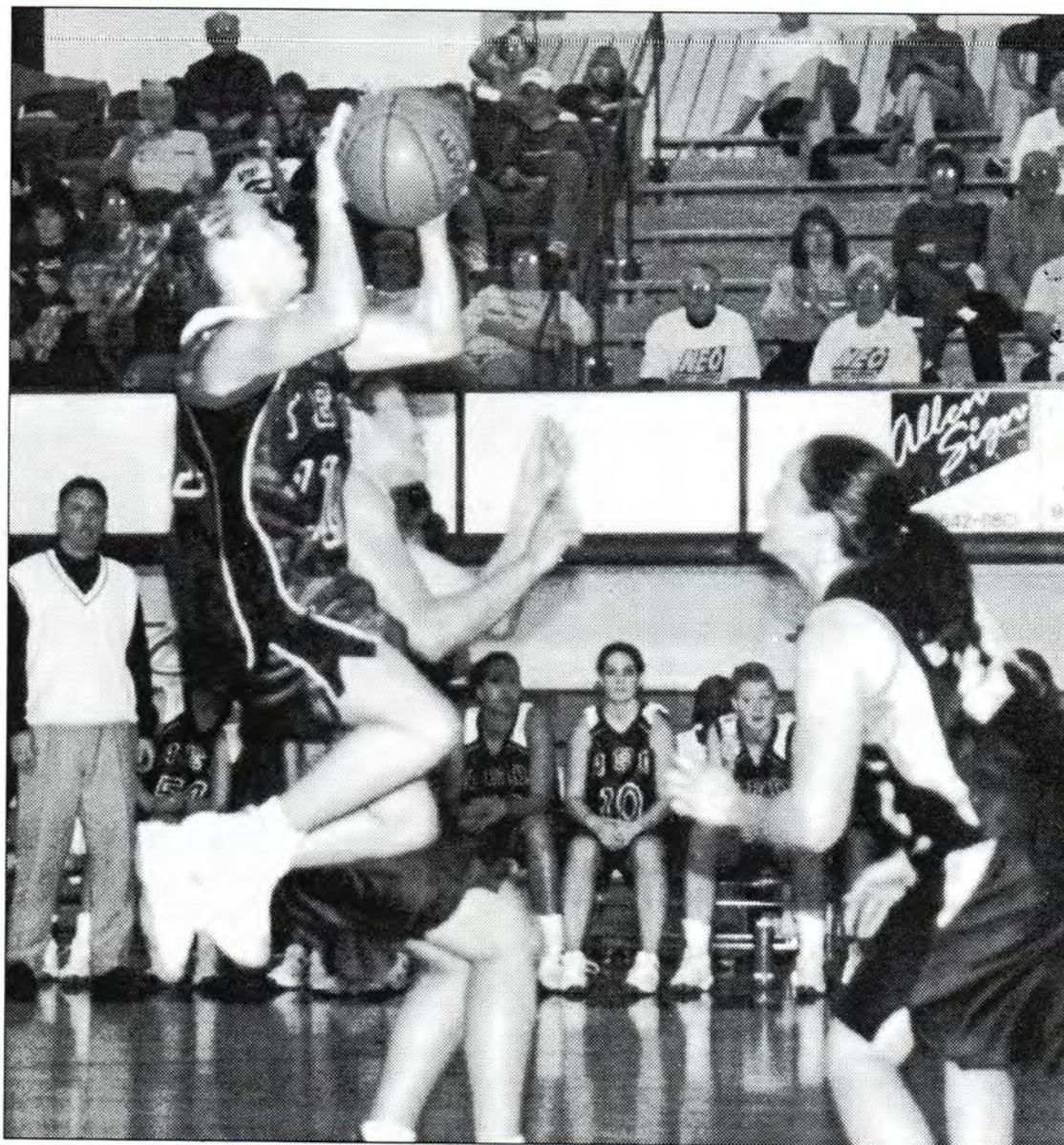

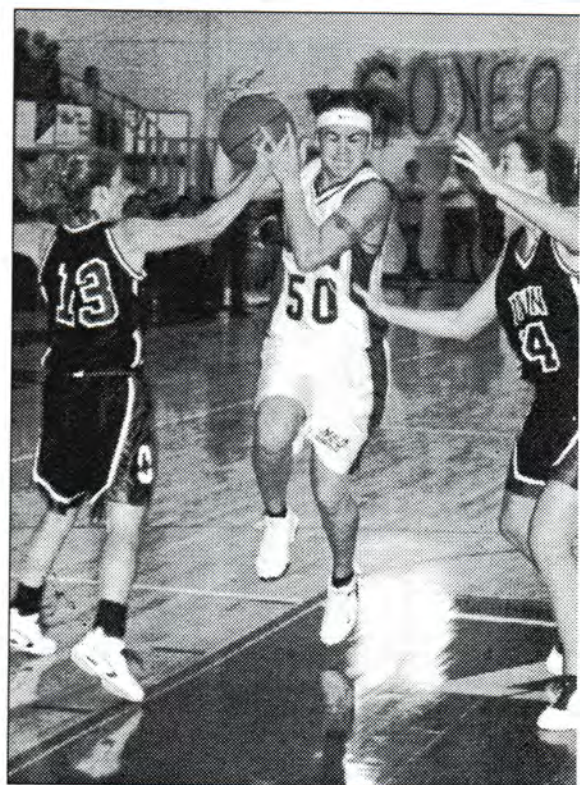

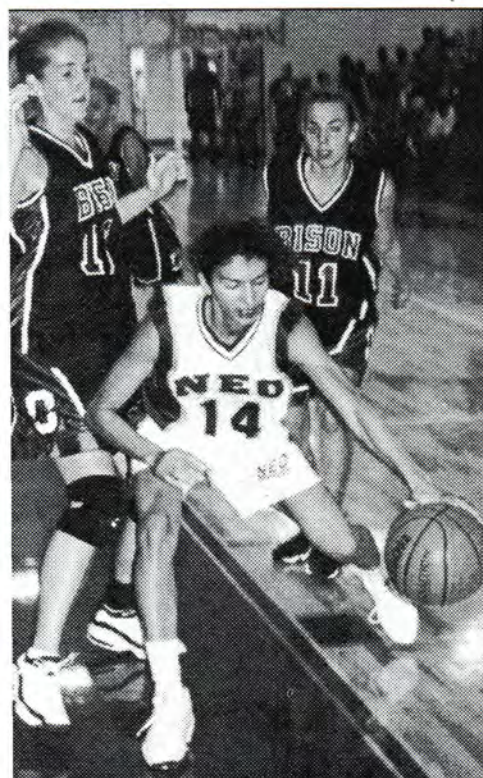

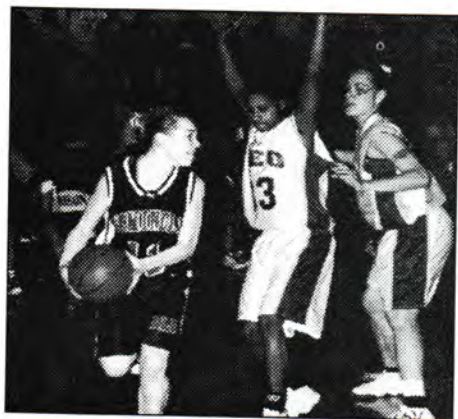
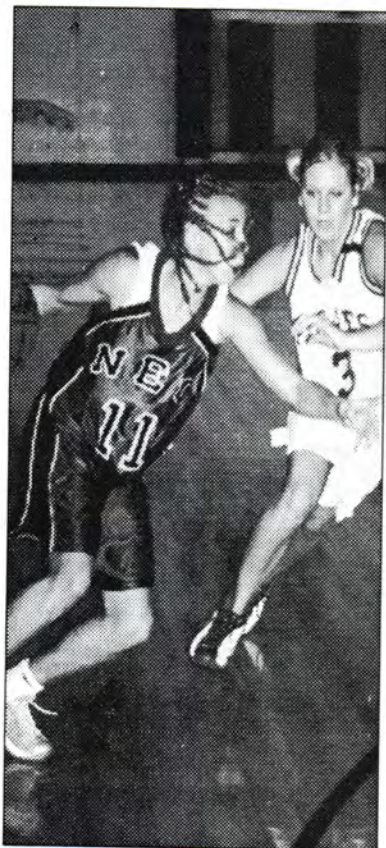

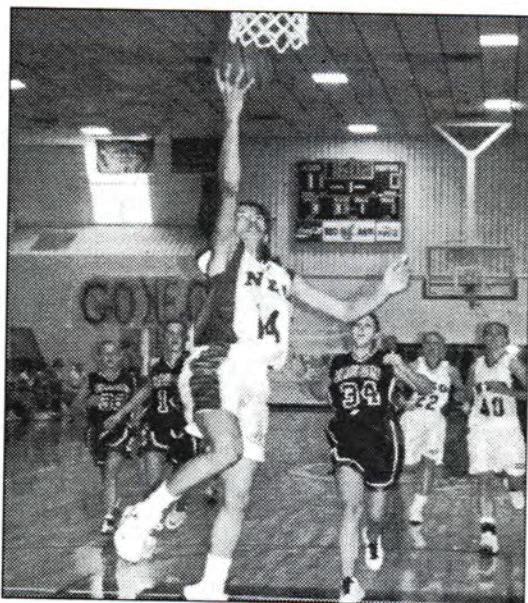

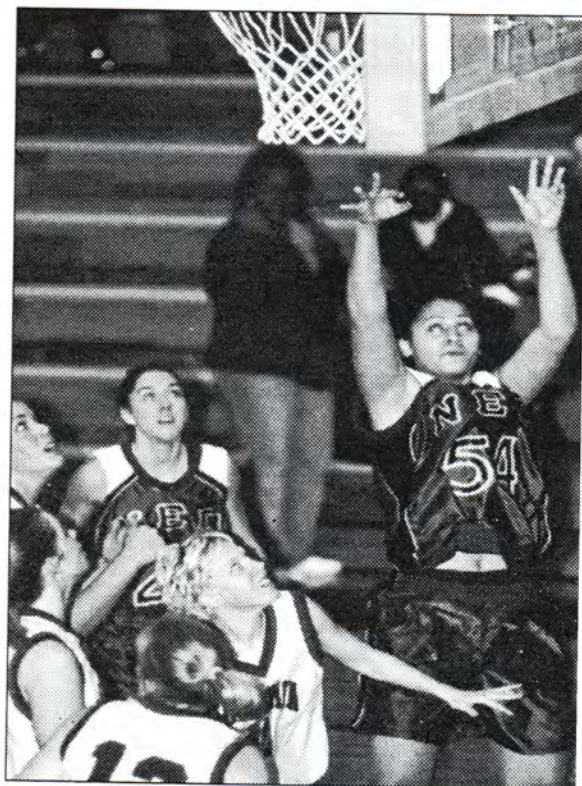

Following only three years as head coach of the Lady Norse basketball program, B.J. Smith submitted his resignation to become head women's basketball coach at

Southeast Missouri State University in Cape Girardeau, Mo.

"This was a dream come true," said Smith. "Like every coach you want to get to the highest level you

can to see how you compare to other coaches around the country."

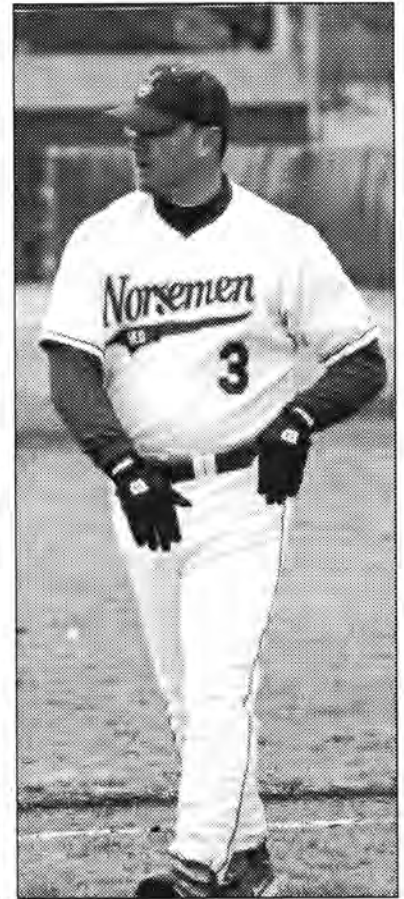

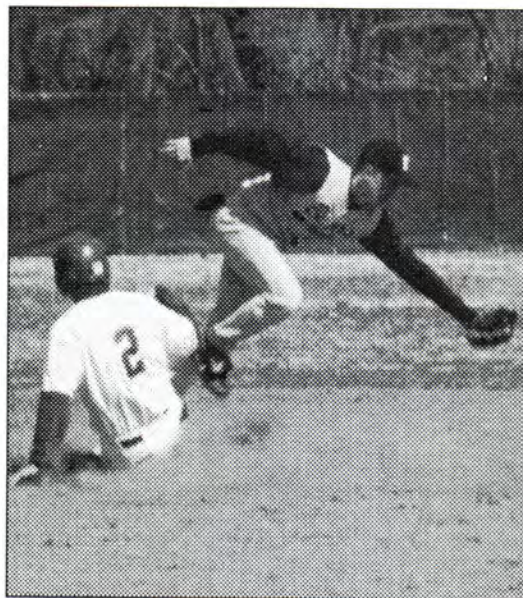

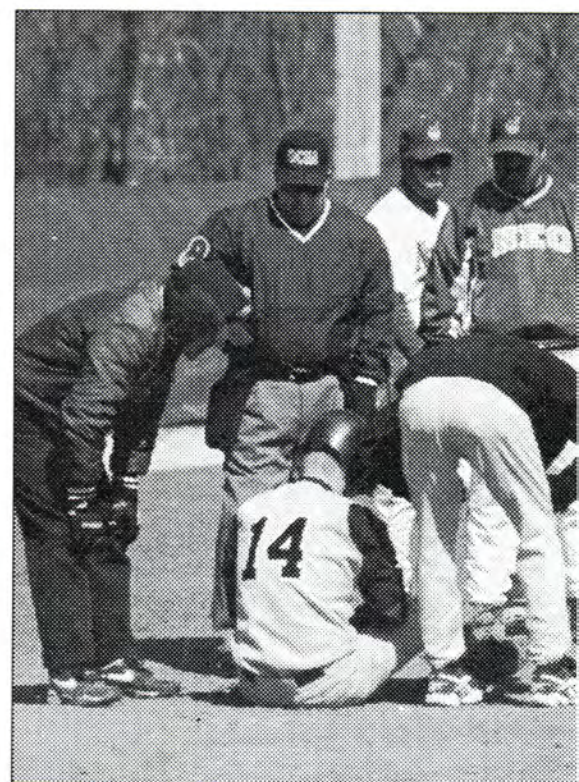

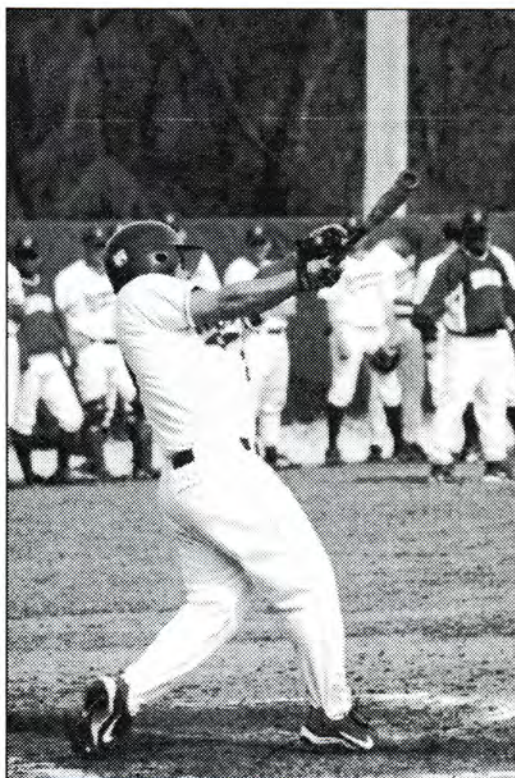

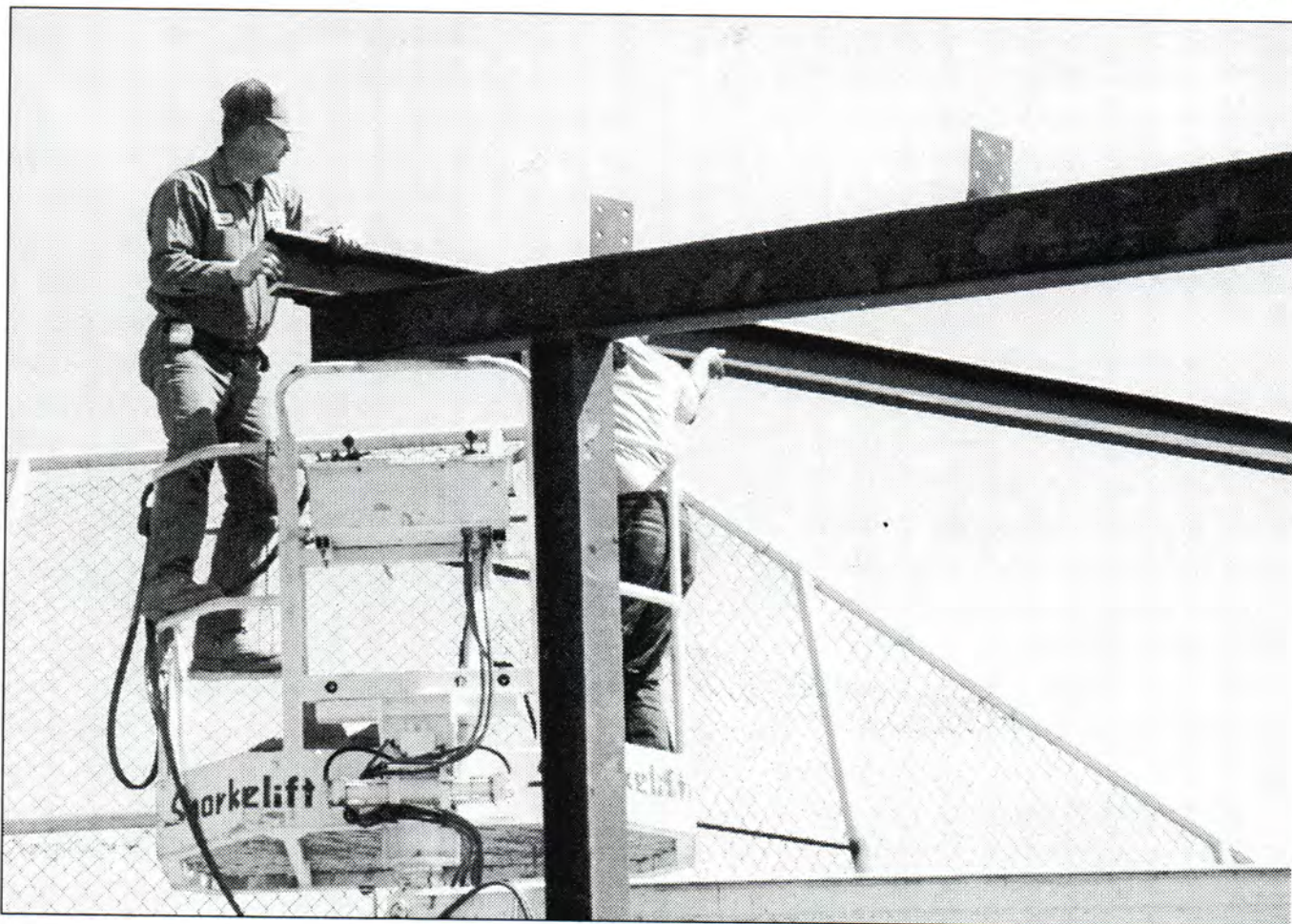

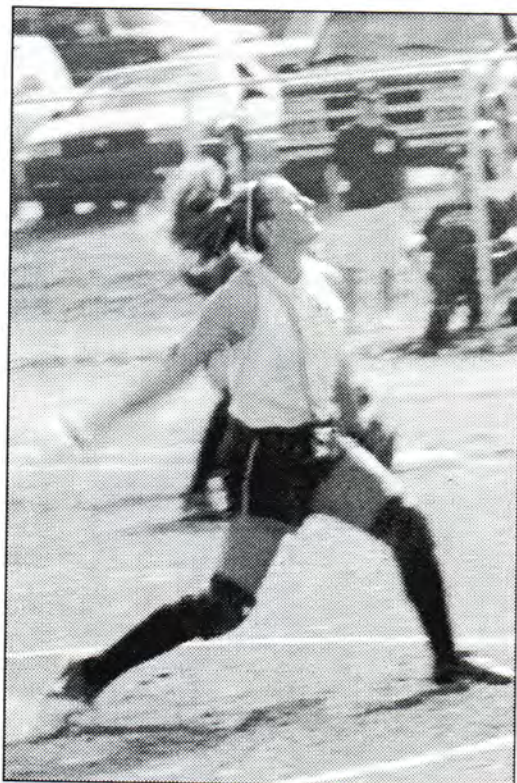

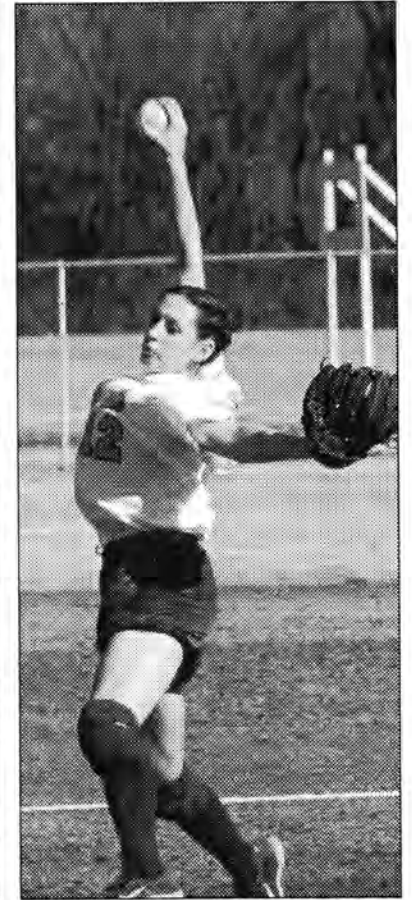

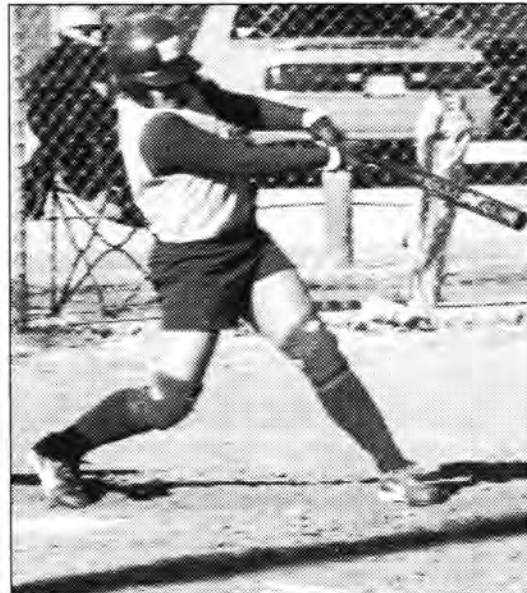

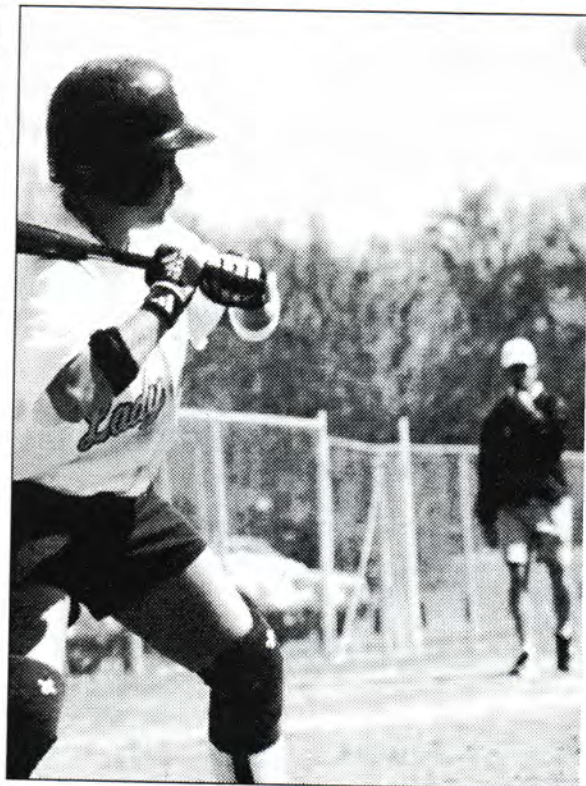

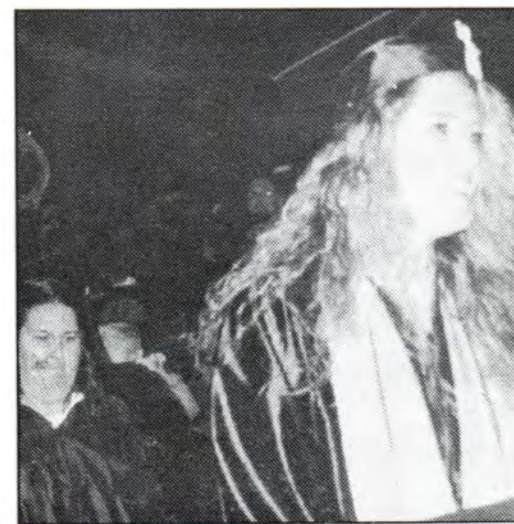

What It Means to be a Horseman

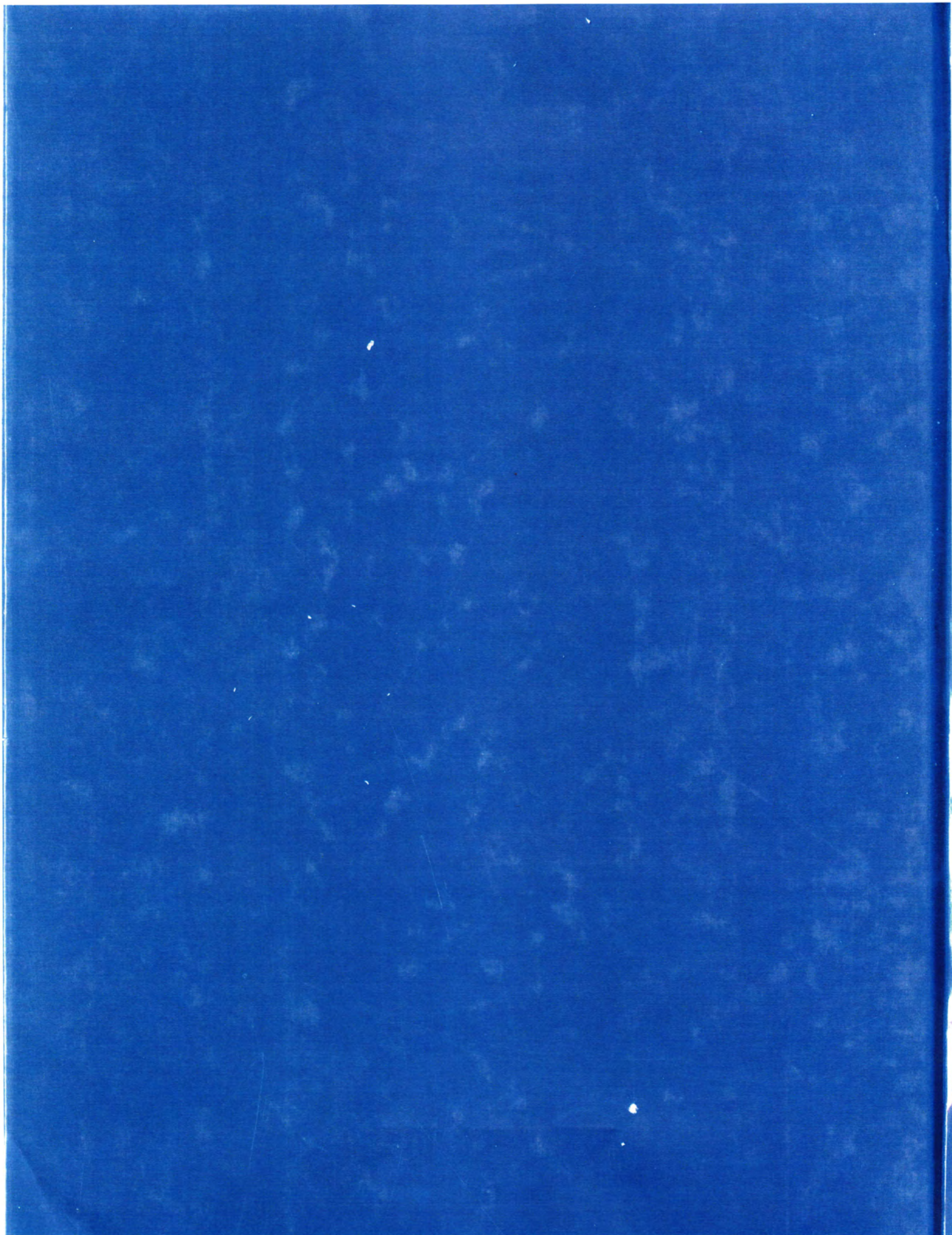
